Description of Ballding. Twoh and what they are dolog.

We had the pleasure of a tour through this establishmant to-day. Our people of Escanaba cannot over-estimate the importance of asanufacturing exterprises to us. Ours is not an agricultural region to any great extent; mining and manufacturing are our reliance, and the work turned out by the planing mill is a staple article in a growing village like the. It is no small undertaking to put an establishment of this kind in complete operation, and the propeleters of this infil

· In the main building we find ope of Roger's surfacing and matching machines having a capacity of dressing 30,000 feet of boards per day. We next come to one of Douglam' moulding suchines; it looks like a complicated piece of michanism, but lumber put into it at one side, names out moulding at the officer at the rate of 10,000 fee, per day. Next to this is that useful machine to wood-workers, a ripaaw. It is used for ripping, rabbeting, plonghing, tenoning, &c., and with the attendance of of two men is espatile of performing the work of twenty-five men by hand. We next find one of Chapman's ogubination machines, having a variety of uses, lat is desired chiefly for each work. It has also a first-class shaping machine for making circular mouldings. Lumber did not get tiese to season before it is put into buildings, we hope these days are past and that the Escansba market will be stocked with seasoned lumber. At a little distance from the mill we come to a lines house erected expressly for stowing lime and it seems particularly adapted to the purpose. By the means of a boisting apparatus the lime is taken to the second shor, and emptted into the bins. We are informed the Company have disposed of over 200 barrels of lime already this season. We saw also a stock of cement and plastering hair in this building.

Some 200 feet from the mill is altusted the store-room, where is kept a stock of doors, sash, blinds &c...

In the lumber yard is found an assortment of lumber of all kinds, the best grades are under cover and we noticed their sheds are being extended to the dock about 150 feet.

The whole establishment is in charge of Mr. C. S. Benth and the clean and orderly appearance of every thing denotes that it is not being neglected.


