The East.

SAM SHARPEY, Diocesan negro minister, died at Freiburg, B. I., on the 2d inst.

The Beecher-Tilton trial was to commence on the 2d inst., and a small pamphlet containing a resume of the scandal, entitled "Crimes in High Places," was being distributed in New York. It is mostly made up from documents already published, and not favorable to the Beecher side.

The West.

CAT. E. H. WARD, one of the largest capitalists of the west, extensively engaged in the iron and vessel business, died at Detroit on the 2d inst., aged 64.

The Ponson House, at Fruitport, Mich., was destroyed by fire the 2d inst. Loss on building and contents, \$120,000. Partly insured in eastern companies.

Two men named Clegg and Deoblock, on the 2d inst., while attempting to enter the Indian Territory, with a load of whiskey, were intercepted by deputy sheriffs when a fight ensued. NEW ORLEANS.

Assembling of the Louisiana Legis-
lature.U. S. Forces Interfere and Elect Certain
Members—A Little Time.

The state house of Louisiana was the scene of great commotion on the assembling of the legislature on the 4th inst. In the House L. A. Wiltz, conservative democrat, was chosen speaker, and C. J. Trevaras, also conservative democrat, was elected clerk. A stormy debate of some length then occurred on the admission of certain conservative members, during which General Debelleau, a brand of soldiers entered the hall, and had his adjutant read two letters from Gov. Kellogg, one of which stated to the general that an illegal body was sitting as the House of Representatives, and that Mr. Vogers, clerk, could furnish him with a list of those members who had been duly elected and as such returned by the returning board. The other letter contained a request to Gen. Debelleau to effect those members who had not been returned as elected by the board.

The KATIE KING HUMBUG.
