High School Heads in Two Day Meet

(By The Associated Press.)

Lansing, Mich., Dec. 1.—The Michigan Association of High School Principals, opened a two-day session here today. President Charles McKenney, of the State Normal College and Major J. L. Griffith, athletic commissioner for the western conference, were scheduled as the principal speakers.

Friday the Michigan Inter-scholastic Athletic Association was to meet in conjunction with the principals' meeting to discuss high school athletics.

L. L. Forsythe, principal of the Ann Arbor High School will preside at the athletic meeting, at which time ten directors of athletics from various parts of the state will be chosen to cooperate with A. W. 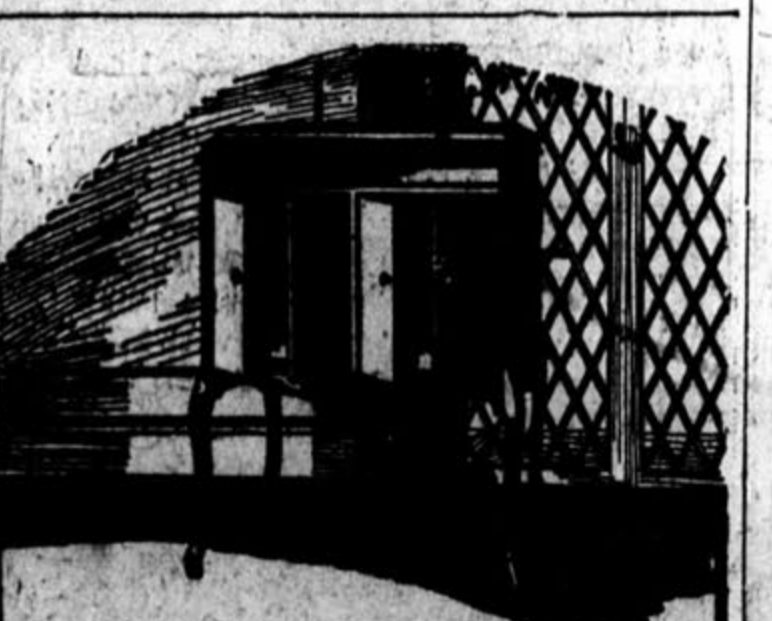

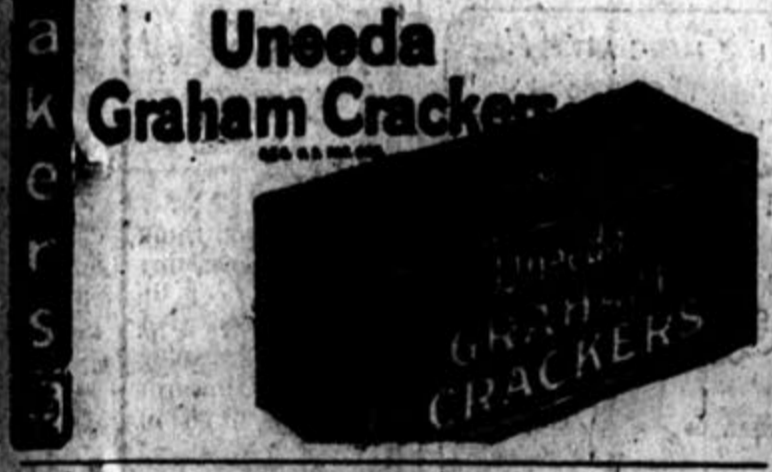

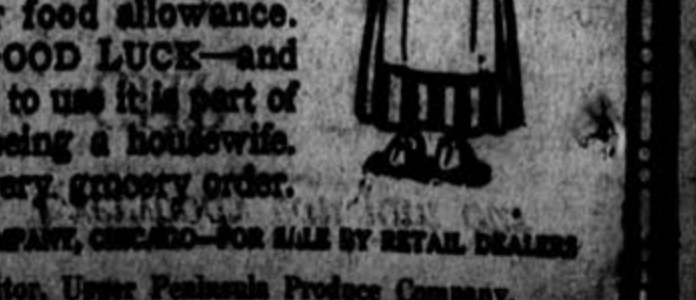
