#### **GIVES WARNING** TO VIOLATORS

Prosecuting Attorney Issues Statement of Laws Controlling Operation of Automobiles in Michigan.

Official statement of the provisions

1st. Every person now owning or hereafter acquiring a motor vehicle, shall for each vehicle owned by him file in the office of the Secretary ot State, a statement containing his name and address wish a brief descrip tion of the vehicle so owned by him to be registered including the name of the maker, factory, number, style of vehicle and motor power, on a blank to be prepared and furnished by the secretary of state for that purpose. certificate and seal, a fee of \$2.00 shall be paid to the secretary of state.

2nd. It is the duty of the owner bi each and every motor vehicle at all neys filter the blood of impurities times to have displayed upon the rear of such vehicle to be plainly visible. the number assigned to the machine by the secretary of state and also to have the seal attached to the vehicle.

3rd. There shall also be displayed upon each motor vehicle in use upon public highways during the period of one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, two lamps in the front of said motor vehicle and also a red light in the rear of said motor vehicle.

At that time also, it may be noted, the greatest ocean depths in which cables were laid was only about 16,404 feet. Within the past year a cable has been successfully laid by a German company in the Pacific ocean in the vicinity of the

Luikin islands at a depth of 26,246 feet. In still another instance the author of a well known text book on telegraphy, published in the 60's of the ast century, expressed the opinion that while the idea of duplex telegraphy, or the sending of two messages at once over one wire, was very beautiful in its way, it must be looked upon as little more than a feat of intellectal gymnastics, and quite useless from practical point of view. Within less than a docade after the publication of this opinion, not only was the duplex telegraph in practical operation, but quadrupled telegraphy, or the sending of four messages at once over one wire, was also an accomplished

An ordinance relative to the construction, maintenance and running of Livery and Sale stables within the city of Escanaba

The City of Escanaba ordains:

Sec 1 That it shall bereafter be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to construct, maintain or run any livery or sale stable within the city of Fs unaba within, adjoining or adjacent to my residence part or - pertion of said city nearer to or within 100 feet of any re-idence or any building used or occupied as a residence. This ordinance shall not include its remain Street of said city.

Sec. 2. Any livery or sale stable constructed, maintained or run in violation of this ordinance shall be and bereby is declared a nuisance. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeapor and upon conviction thereof by any court or competent jurisdiction, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100 00 or be imprisoned in the city to county jail not to exceed . 90 days or Ly both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court. Each day that any person or corporation shall maintain or run any livery or sale stable contrary to the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense.

Provided that this ordinance shall not apply to or affect any livery or sale stable now constructed, maintained or run in any residence portion of the city of Escanaba

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 20 days from and after the passage and publication. The city of Escanaba ordains: Sec. 1. That from and after the date when this ordinance takes effect. it shall be unlawful for any person, company or corporation to sell, dispose or give any cannon fireer dynamite bombs, dynamite canes, or other explosives of like dangerous

character within the city of E canaba. Sec. 2. That from and after the taking effect of this crabmace, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to shoot, fire, discharge, or cause to be exploded any cannon firecrackers, giant firecra kers, dynamite cars, dynamite bornts, dynamite canes, blank cart ridges from a pistol or revolver, or to shoot, fire, discharge, or explode any other high explosive of dangerous char acter within the city of Escanaba.

Sec. 3. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdeameanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished of fine not exceeding \$55.00 dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail or city jail, not to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine or imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Sec. 4. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty days from and after the day of its passage.




