





It is stated in this publication that Michigan is among the nineteen states that have made a demand upon congress to 'call a convention' for the purpose of submitting a constitutional amendment in the formal language which will be binding upon congress the moment two thirds of all the states have so acted. They are:

Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri. Nebraska, Arkanszs, Texas, Tennyssee, Kentucky, California, Oregon, Nevada, Colorado, Montana, Washington, Idaho, Utah.

Twelve other states have at one time or another passed resolutions asking congress either to "propose" or to "submit" such an amendment or have invited the states to join in a conferrace to work for the reform Their action shows their feeling. . but has not b en taken in binling form. They are: Obio, Indiana, Kansas, West Virginia, North Carolina, Florida. Louisiana, North Dakcta, South Dakcta, Wyoming, Fennsylvania.

> Lansing, Mich., June 19.-Special. -The department of health issues a warning against the use of certain ex plosives for Fourth of July or any similar celebration, calling attention Pupils in Public Schools Failing in to the danger of tetanus and urging rigid enforcement of the law to prevent the sale of certain explosives. The department says:

Deaths from lockjaw result more from our celebration of the Fourth of July than from any other cause. That the increase in the number of fatalities can be prevented is beyond question.

The records of death for the last three years in the United States show that fatalities from tetanus popularly known as 'lockjaw'' follow wounds from explosions of blank cartridges, toy pistols, giant firecrackers, cannon

firecrackers, torpodo canes and pinwheels. The common use of these articles, by children as well as by adults, in the celebration of Independence day, readily explains the unsual leath rate from tetanus in the month of July. In the state of Michigan the use of blank cartridges, by children, is not alone a great risk, but a crimin-



In Michigan, three years ago, there whre, in July, 27 deaths from tetanus, all following wounds received from handling fireworks; and in the United States the number of deaths from the same cause was 415. After the fatali ties were recorded in 1903 the great crusade against the use of improper fireworks on the Fourth of July began : and a decrease in the two following years in the number of deaths is due chiefly to the aroused public sentiment against such use, and the passing of ordinances in many localities against


