ITS HISTORY

IS INTERESTING

"I don't know of a fraternal order in the world that has a more interesting history and origin than that of the Knights of Maccabees," said Robert J. Hauerwas who was recently a visitor "If we go back 2,000 years we find living along the eastern shores of the Mediterranean, in the valleys of Jordan a people most unique. Their origin was in a past already remote and their entire bistory is dominated overcame them. Some of the meanest of the na ion, hoping to gain the favors of their conquerors offered to participate in the heathen rites.

'One Mathias, refusing to be a traifor to his country, gathered about him an army and resisted the king. But his reign was short. An old man, he could not long endure the privations he had to endure. Lying upon his deathbed, he anointed his son, Judas Asmoneus. His followers combined the initials of the words, 'Me Gamoca Florm, ' forming the word Me-ka-be and Jadas became Judas Maccateus

"The war was long and bloody and many of the faithful fell and their homes were left without a protector. And that the widows and the families who were left busbandless and tatherless should not want, it was ordered to set apart from the spoils of war some portion to be used for the support and maintenance of those who had been left without a protector.

"The Knights of Maccabees have taken this history as a basis for their organization name. The organization has since been reorganized. of course, but on the anniversary of the day when this provision was made by the king of Isarel, the 'Knights of Maccabees' were founded."
