# CONGRESS CONVENES TODAY

## FINAL SESSION IS CALLED; BIG WELCOME GIVEN

### No Statement Regarding Delivery of Wilson's Message.

### Will Close Work of the Sixty-Sixth Congress of the United States.

(BULLETIN) WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—President Wilson has just called for another day of the sixty-sixth Congress in the morning of tomorrow's session. Since the president's decision to appear in person it will be the first time in his public appearance since he was taken sick during the western tour in the summer of the year of outbreak were a year ago.

(BY ASSOCIATED PRESS) WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—A day of cooperation and friendly relations between the two houses of the United States Congress was before them as President Wilson presided over the opening of tomorrow's session. The president also delivered a brief talk after he had received a great ovation on his arrival in the seat.

The senator did not want to continue the past administration but said that in the next four years he hoped to have a greater feeling for friends and a better (Harney), in the attack on the government.

The talk which was not containing of any questions in detail was delivered in a brief and unemotional manner.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—The third and final session of the sixty-sixth Congress of the United States convened this morning when President Wilson presided over the opening of the session. The speaker, after the public addresses, turned to the general session.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—The Senate was in session only forty-five minutes today when the House, after a brief recess, adjourned for the day.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—President Wilson did not indicate today whether or not he would appear in person to send his message to Congress to be delivered when the congressional committee called on him today to notify him formally that Congress is in session.

The members of the committee after returning from the White House where they met the president in the blue room said that he walked to the room but appeared weak and pale.

It is rather surprising that any officer who stands charged with a criminal offense would try to prevent his being brought to trial on the charge unless he is guilty. For his own personal interests, it would seem he ought to be one of the first to insist to have the case brought up at a trial, if he is innocent.

It appears that these three federal officials would prefer to be unjustly accused of murder, and avoid being brought to trial, than to have an opportunity to show that they are innocent.

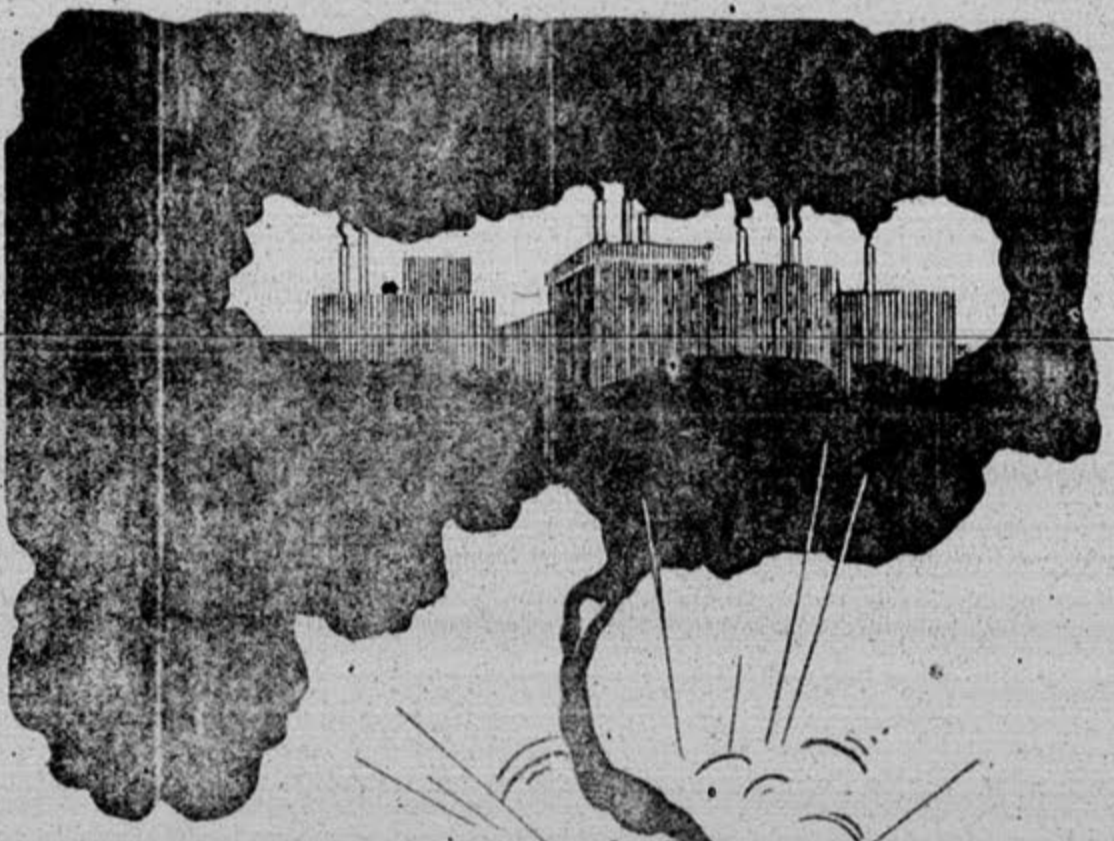
