

CREAMERY MEN OF MICHIGAN DESIRE 3 CENT POSTAGE

Sixty Per Cent of the Creamery Men in State Favor the Increase in Stamp Rates.

LANSING, Aug. 20.—The proposed postage increase is accepted as an agreed fact in the near future by creamery men in the state who recently answered a questionnaire by the Michigan Association of Creamery Owners and Managers. Replies have been received from approximately 60 per cent of the 300 state creameries by R. F. Frary, secretary of the association. In a report to the State Farm Bureau he states that approximately 60 per cent of the creamery men offer no objection to the proposed higher postage rate. In the larger part of questions, the creamery men were asked to express their opinion on the proposed increase. About 60 per cent of those who returned answers expressed themselves as unopposed to the check stamp increase. Figures gathered by the creamery association indicate that a two-cent check tax would cost creameries in the state...

PORT OF MISSING AUTOS IS FOUND

Care Driven Into Quarry Pool and Lost; Cars Piled On Top of Others Under the Water.

CHICAGO, Aug. 20.—One hundred automobiles are now estimated to have been hidden beneath the waters of the "Continental" quarry near Summit. It was announced yesterday after further investigations by a diver. The cars, piled on top of each other, show that some of them have been in the quarry more than two years, according to the police.
