

HELIGOLAND HAS CONTINUAL FOURTH OF JULY AND IT IS NOT A SAFE AND SANE ONE, EITHER

Work of Blowing Up German Fortress Starts Early Each Day.

Pet. Defense of Kaiser Slowly Being Wiped Off Face of the Earth by His Own Countrymen.

HELIGOLAND. Aug. 30.—Every day is a Fourth of July celebration on the little rock island of Heligoland. And not a safe and sane celebration at that.

At sunrise the 1,000 German workmen who are dismantling the pet fortress and naval harbor of Kaiser William II set off their爆破. The handbills begin to appear the day after Christmas. The PNT make the babies in the house make up one of the greatest scenes in Europe. The German population of Heligoland, like the German admirals of the fleet, has been reduced to a skeleton. The last of the German admirals of the fleet, Count von Spee, must be a skeleton too. With agreement made, all the gunners are sent away.

BELEM PRISON IN MEXICO IS NOW REFORMED

Worst-Penal Institution in World Has Been Cleaned Up, It Is Said.

Men and Women Who Are Both Confined in Prison Will Now Receive Better Treatment.

MEXICO CITY. Aug. 30.—Belem prison, which was described to the world as "the most infamous prison to be found in Latin America," has been reformed. The former known as one of the grimiest spots of Mexico, in which 1,500 inmates, mostly criminals of all classes of offenders, of the law who were held together in indescribable conditions and to be sentenced to Belem, was considered the worst fate imaginable to be meted out to a criminal.

Sounds for the teaching of manual training and the rudiments of culture that are now maintained; the men who were in the prison being divided into five groups for instruction. Such schools are not yet provided for the women, but according to Director Vazquez they will be installed within the next two months. Alibals are wholly gone and sufficient.

Shower baths have been installed and several large fountains have been placed within the paths where those who have the inclination may wash their clothes. There is a large parade ground for both men and women and the code of discipline are few.

Smoking is allowed at all times and

up perpendicular but at its southeast end is a small beach upon which the German navy erected a cooling oil station, freshwater reservoirs, seaplane sheds and docks. Here also was constructed a naval harbor thoroughly protected by sea walls which was capable of accommodating eight or ten destroyers or cruisers and an unlimited number of submarines.

From this harbor many destroyers sailed out to participate in the Battle of Jutland and the Battle of Heligoland Bight.

The German admiralty converted Heligoland into a sort of iron battleship. Three great batteries were planted in the rock in a manner which gives the cliff the appearance of the interior of a four-deck battleship.

Around the 11-inch guns and their carriages have been sawed into small pieces and thrown into scrap steel piles. Workmen are now laying electrical cables in the concrete walls and mines prepared to shouting down all the masonry.

The seaplane sheds, coal bins, oil tanks and water reservoirs along the coast have also been destroyed and dynamited, and hundreds of soldiers are grubbing away at the gun bases of the never-give-up the foundations of the great naval works of the naval nation, preparatory to removing every improvement which might be of use to Germany's future navy.

Heligoland once was a popular summer resort but the German visitors can no longer go there because of the constant blasting and the evidence of devastation which affords a sad monument to Germany's once proud navy. The native residents of the island are righteous to the destruction as most of them were born under the British flag before Heligoland was transferred to the British to the Germans.

Every prisoner has received such additions to his daily diet as his circumstances permit. Special attendants are provided for the small and deaf women prisoners, of whom there are many, the authorities also providing them with food and a place to sleep.

"Truth Alibi" has been abolished. This was a long corridor thru which the condemned were led on their way to execution and in almost 50 years there is no record of one escaping or remaining alive. No executions are permitted within the prison.

Belem has been notorious for its unhygienic conditions and to be sentenced to Belem was considered the worst fate imaginable to be meted out to a criminal.

Our Norse kings every year offered up their favored sons on the tree, and in times of famine the Swedes sacrificed their King. When great victory was won over the Romans, the Norsemen offered up their captives' and their horses as a thank offering to the gods.

So it is not hard to see how gradually being hanged was the fate of the English criminal instead of being subjected to the wheel as in France or Germany, and now we in turn let our to the custom only recently discarded for electrocution.

RADIO SHOW TO OPEN TOMORROW WILL BE NOVEL

Chicago to Have First Show of Its Kind Ever Staged.

President Harding Will Talk Over Wireless Phone to the Hall; Many New Things On Exhibit.

CHICAGO, Aug. 30.—The National Radio Show, the first of its kind ever

held in this country, will open here tomorrow, with manufacturers from all over the country represented, amid the plaudits of the many wireless men whom the show has drawn to Chicago.

The Radio Show, besides containing the exhibits of hundreds of manufacturers of radio apparatus, will also show the various developments of wireless communication since the day when Marconi flashed his famous message across the Atlantic. Ancient sets of fifteen and twenty years ago, with their coherents and detector crystals, will be displayed alongside of the very latest in radio construction, instruments capable of sending and receiving messages half-way round the globe.

Seated in his chair in the White House at Washington, President Harding will talk over a land wire to the naval station a few miles distant, where his voice will be broadcasted by wireless telephone. The message will be picked up at the Radio Show, where

it will be amplified and scattered

through the hall by loud speakers. Other prominent officials in Washington will also be heard by this method.

The entire wireless exhibit will be the Great Lakes Naval Training Station at the Pageant of Progress held here has been installed and will be operated. Fred Sherman has sent down a rival exhibit.

E. P. Glavin, inventor of the radio-controlled automobile, will give his machine in working order during the show, demonstrating the method of wireless control used on a battlefield during the recent airplane bombing tests. Special wireless telephone transmitting outlets have been set up, and music and speeches will be sent out nightly. An airplane will be equipped with instruments and the pilot directed in his evolution by radio.

The exhibition is being held in conjunction with the first national convention of the American Radio Relay League, a nation-wide organization of commercial and amateur wireless men. Addresses will be given by Hiram P.

Maxim, president of the league, and the other officers.

Among others expected to deliver technical papers are Dr. Lee de Forest, well-known eastern radio man; Major E. H. Armstrong, of R. V. Achas of Purdue University; Prof. C. M. Janaky of the University of Minnesota, and Prof. D. Terry of the University of Wisconsin.

NEW LAWS FOR GOVERNMENT OF RENTALS IS PLAN

American Bar Association Will Take Up Matter at Annual Meeting to Be Held in Cincinnati.

CINCINNATI, Aug. 29.—It is reported that the matter of enacting laws to govern rental of realty property will receive serious consideration at the annual convention of the American Bar Association, to be held in Cincinnati from August 30 to September 2.

The committee on inter-state changes in statute laws in the report which will present to the convention on Thursday evening, September 1, will say:

"In the field of landlord and tenant law, we find several examples of unusual legislation. Shortage of housing accommodations has given rise to an abnormal demand, which resultant high rentals. These in turn have been made the justification for legislative regulation of rentals, terms and conditions of tenancy. Real legislation has taken the form either of (1) statutes like those in New York, requiring of varying statutory remedies of the landlord in such a way as to compel or induce him to accept reasonable rents or (2) comprehensive legislation like that contained in the act of Congress applicable to the District of Columbia which treats rental property as affected with a public interest and subjects the relationship of landlord and tenant to minimum regulation.

The New York type of statute simply takes away the remedy of eviction where the tenant which the landlord claims is located is considered to be unreasonable, as in example where the rent demanded by the landlord is, in the opinion of the courts, excessive. The New York legislature has followed its precedent and now, which is more than ever, continues to exceed the rent in the previous year. This follows on the heels of a tenant who pays the reasonable rental.

The act of Congress authorizes the commission of the District of Columbia to impose similar terms of leases to be reasonable rentals and terms of tenancy and to determine other inter-state controversies between landlord and tenant. The authority of the commission and its procedure are analogous to that of the interstate commerce commission in the field of interstate commerce. Both types of statutes have now been upheld by the Supreme Court of the United States in its confirmation of the right of Congress to regulate in the interest of the public welfare during the abnormal business conditions following the war."

The committee further reports that one of the most striking features of our recent history is the absence of any large amount of reconstruction legislation with less, rather more, in the line of regulatory legislation.
