

THE TWO ENTENTES SNUGGLE UP.

Whatever may ultimately come out of the row at Genoa over the announcement that Germany and Russia have anticipated general action and have stolen a march on the rest of Europe by signing a special economic treaty, the immediate effect has been an alignment of the governments composing the big and little ententes. Hitherto the Little Entente has been the protege and, to some extent, the creature of France, and has basked less completely in British and Italian approval, while Italy and Jugo-Slavia have been fuming almost continuously over Fiume. But in their note of rebuke to Germany, the countries composing the two combines come into association as temporary allies.

Any estimate of what this movement presages in the way of permanent association can be only speculative, but it may very probably show the cohesive tendency that approachment resulting from strong community of interest and from the instinct for self preservation possesses; and its ultimate development will almost certainly depend very largely upon the amount of obstinancy Germany shows in sticking to her new playfellow, the Russian soviet government.






