

TRY STATE'S ANTI-SYNDICALISM LAW

20 ALLEGED COMMUNISTS ON TRIAL NOW

Charged With Plotting Overthrow of the Government.

First Court Action Taken in Big Clean-Up Which Started in Berrien County.

(By Associated Press)

St. Joseph, Mich., Oct. 17.—Twenty alleged communists charged with plotting to overthrow the government of the United States by force, will be arraigned today in the first trial of Michigan's anti-syndicalism law which was passed as a wartime measure.

Sixteen of the 20 were arrested on August 22 by the sheriff and forces of the state part of justice agency and deputy sheriffs, when they descended down on a woodland cabin in Berrien county, near Bad Axe man, and instructed what the government alleges was the national convention of the communist party of America, representatives in this country of the third international of Russia.

Between 70 and 80 radicals had been gathered at the meeting in the wild-dome country along the shores of Lake Michigan, the government agents claim, but all had fled them before the agents arrived.

Three men, including W. Z. Foster, of a steel strike fame, were later arrested at Chicago and extradited. Another, Joseph Z. Sels, was extradited from New York.

CLUB WOMEN OF MICHIGAN APPEALED TO IN ACCEPTING SHARE OF RESPONSIBILITY

FLINT, Mich., Oct. 18.—An appeal to Michigan club women to "accept their responsibility" and make their chief aim in life the building of better citizenship and the fostering of all these things that go to make up that better citizenship" was sounded here today by Mrs. William R. Averell of Detroit, president of the Michigan Federation of Women's Clubs, in her message before the annual convention of the Federation.

Mrs. Averell urged all club women in the state to accept the responsibilities of public office, to strive constantly for more adequate educational facilities for the youth of the state, to exercise their franchise right and to carry on a fight against any legislation of the Volstead prohibition laws. In short, she urged that the club women of Michigan—whose status is so high and work considerably in behalf of the Prohibition program that the state will be the recognized leader in all measures pertaining to women's work.

Makes Wide Appeal.

"We consider the Federation and its efforts we are impressed with its wide appeal, the number and the progressive position our clubs have assumed, however varied their interests. As after year we find in this platform planks advancing education, democracy, health, education and world peace. We have no right to force our ideas on others. We must add our bags to those so many others who practice the best of happiness to making the world better to look upon.

WATER SUPPLY.

Exhaustive investigation into the city's water supply to ascertain as far as possible, the cause of the acid taste noticed for the first time in the drinking water Saturday morning has convinced A. P. Roddatt, superintendent of water and lights, that the source

leaks, as he had at first supposed, could not be attributed to an "over-dose" of chlorine, as many had believed.

Chlorine is used at the city water plant for purifying the drinking water, or ridding it of bacteria or germs. Mr. Roddatt is convinced, after having made repeated tests on the water since Saturday, that the medicine-like taste was due to chlorine admitted in the city water from some unknown source, probably coming up the bay from the chemical plant at West. There were heavy winds sweeping in the bay Saturday, churning the water into fury.
