BEARS VICTOR OVER BULLS

Unexpected Increase Is Noted in Brokers' Loans

New York, Oct. 18 (AP)—The bear party aided by the confidence-shaking upturn in brokers' loans, turned the tables on the bulls in decisive fashion in today's stock market, more than evening up the score after the hasty manner in which it was driven to cover in the last half hour of trading yesterday.

The utility shares again broke wide open, and the general list came tumbling down almost half as far. The utilities, as measured by the Standard Statistics Co., Associated Press price index of 20 leading issues of the group, reached the lowest level since late last July.

Loans Unfavorable The brokers' loan figures were distinctly disappointing, although new financing was generally regarded as playing an important part in the upturn of \$38,000,000.

There was little in the day's news to influence the market. Earnings on Hudson Motor for the third quarter were announced at \$1.77 per share, as compared to \$3.79 in the previous quarter, but this had been foreshadowed by developments in the motor industries appearing were generally favorable.
