HIGHER THAN EVER

The Mississippi River Floods of Lass Week Octobese.

MURPHYSORO, Illa, June 3.— The present high water in the Mississipsi river reaches the highest point in the history of the country for thirty years. Forty thousand acres of land are submerged, destroying 1,000 acres of growing crops and carrying away dwelling houses, barns and fences, leaving 1,000 families with nothing to keep want from their door. Fully 500 of the 1,000 families are tenants and have neither food nor clothing and are calling for aid from their more fortunate neighbors. No ostimate can yet be put upon the projectly destroyed, but it will reach far beyond anything ever known in this country.

St. Louis, June 3.—Now that the great flood has about passed away in the South, the following estimate is made of the losses occasioned by the dight water, a loss -unprecedented in the history of floods: Missouri, #1,000,000; Tennessee, #1,900,000; Kentucky, #200,000; Mississippi, #1,900,000; Louissiana, #5,000,000.
