He had already shown for years a tendency to pulmonary weakness. Last week when he came to this home this office, it was said at the time that he was only slightly indisposed. His exact condition was suppressed until yesterday. Mr. Gould began sinking from his physician, had Dr. Jamesway in consultation, but they said that nothing could be done but make Mr. Gould's last hours as comfortable as possible.
