Why Men Fall in Business. Experience is the best, and often the most expensive teacher. There are two ways of obtaining experience—one by getting it yourself and paying for it, and the other by observing the experiences of others and profiting thereby. The latter is by far the cheaper.

In this connection it is interesting to observe that twenty twelve thousand failures occurred in the United States and Canada in 1892. Most of the failures were attributed to "insufficient capital," but a close analysis of the reasons given would, we believe, show that a lack of experience was the foundation of a vast majority of these misadventures in business. Other causes, of course, are mentioned. Of the 12,000 failures over 1,000 were attributed to fraud, nearly 2,000 to incompetence, the same amount to disaster and over 3,000 to "lack of means."—New York Mail.
