The Peruvian government has agreed to pay \$4,000,000 to the American citizens whose property was damaged and destroyed by the anti-masonic riot at Mendoza last March.

McDougal's big 143 was hauled at West Superior Saturday. Superior ditches state that the freight steamer for which the keel has been laid and the small passenger steamers are the only boats on which work will be done during the next few weeks.

Every dollar of the National bank circulation of today is as good as gold in any and every State of the Union. If the bank breaks and pays no depositor a dollar, its money remains as good as gold. This will not be true of banks amenable only to the State. Millions of business men know the virtues of the old system, whose business men hustled around to get clear of the money taken in during the day, fearing lest it should be at 10 or 20 per cent discount by to-morrow, as it often was in Inter Ocean.

It is announced that the coast and geodetic survey hope soon to settle the national ownership of Pope's Polly Island, which is near the boundary line between Maine and New Brunswick. Whether it belongs in this country or in Canada has been a matter of dispute for a century or so. One would suppose that a question of boundary on such a well-known coast would be settled in less time than that, but perhaps it isn't to be wondered at when we remember that there are still disputed interpretations of passages in the new testament written in the first century, and that the proper pronunciation of the Latin language is still in dispute, although that has been the language of scholars for 17 centuries.

Very much admired by many are the deep yellowish brown straws called "unburned bread." The plant is rather coarse. This kind of straw looks well trimmed with sea lace, rather coarse ribbed, and small plaited tassels ropes.

AMONG THE GEMS

The Orloff diamond is believed to be responsible for 67 murders. Diamond smelters that 1,200 to the carat have been cut in Holland.

When Lord Palmerston was buried in Westminster abbey, the officiating clergyman threw into the grave several diamonds and other rings as a peace offering.

When Cardinal Borromeo was buried in Milan, a large gold collar with five emeralds surrounded by diamonds was placed in his tomb, and still remains there.

The great South African diamond found in the Kimberley mines in 1866 weighed 452 carats rough. According to the ordinary rules of valuation, it is worth \$1,166,880.

The diamond worn by the sultan in the sultan's of his plume on parade days was valued up from a stone worth \$100,000 to \$1,000,000 by the sultan of Constantinople during the reign of Mohammed IV.

When the French crown jewels were inventoried in 1817, there were 3,547 diamonds, 506 pearls, 289 rubies, 134 sapphires, 159 emeralds, 17 topazes, 3 amethysts and a number of unclassified stones.

RAILROAD TIES. Canadian railroads stretch 15,588 miles. The Nickel Plate last year increased its equipment by 10 locomotives and 1,000 box cars.

Under the name of Wichita Falls and Oklahoma a company has been incorporated and a charter filed in Texas. The Lake Shore now owns 2,635.41 miles of track, of which 2,317.25 are laid with steel. The company owns 584 locomotives and 21,000 cars.

A Detroit city ordinance requires railway to sell eight passage tickets for 25 cents on the cars during certain hours for the benefit of workmen.

At the Dupuy shops of the New York Central four water tanks have been built that stand 50 feet from the ground and have a combined capacity of 200,000 gallons.

It has been arranged to build a branch line from Hillman station on the Pennsylvania and Northwestern, to the headwaters of Clover run, Clearfield county, Pa. A preliminary survey has already been made.

ODDS AND ENDS. It costs 2 cents to put up a can of tomatoes. One cent piece are being introduced in Oakland, Cal., for the first time. The smallest gold tender formerly used was recent pieces.

In Michigan 8,707 women are running farms, and they cultivate 470,000 acres, valued at \$1,500,000. Their earnings aggregate \$4,800,000.

For several years past nearly all the State pencils used throughout the United States have been made at one factory at Charlottesville, Va.
