Michigan Marine.
During the past ten years Michigan has developed a great shipbuilding industry. In 1880 she led all the inland states in number of steam and sail vessels and volume of tonnage; but New York, Maine, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and California of the seaboard states were far ahead of her. The figures for 1892 show that Michigan now not only leads all the inland states but has passed all the seaboard states excepting New York, giving her second place among the states of the Union in volume of vessel tonnage. In the last six years, Michigan tonnage has increased seventy-three per cent against 10 per cent for New York. In 1890, the total tonnage built in the United States was 560,000 tons; Michigan, 169,091 tons; northern lakes, 108,526; western rivers, 14,506; total, 294,123. Of this, Michigan yards furnished sixty-five vessels measuring 45,733 tons. That year the steam tonnage built on the lakes was forty per cent greater than that built by the seaboard states.

Michigan with its two thousand miles of coast lines, its hundreds of harbors, its bulky products—ore, lumber, salt and grain—and its abundant supply of superior iron and timber for shipbuilding, is destined to hold its present proud position as the great inland vessel state of the country.—[Ex.]

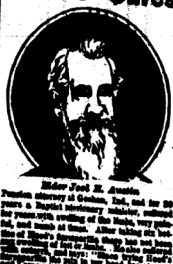

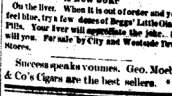
