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Don't Hide Money in Stocks.

In the excitement and nervousness of the present unfortunate situation, people who earnestly desire a return of better times must not forget that the restoration of prosperity depends to a certain extent upon themselves as individuals.

One thing that every reasonable man will resolve to do in such a time as the present is to restrain himself from taking a course which if pursued by everybody would lead to dangerous contraction of the currency.

If a man has money in the bank and feels doubtful as to the solvency of the institution he has a legal right to draw it out and put it into a stocking, but if he thinks broadly before taking this action, he will be apt to doubt whether he has a moral right to do a thing which may tend toward the involvement of the whole community in financial distress.

During the year ending June 30 last, as shown by figures taken from the forth-coming report of the attorney-general, there were a total of 18,974 criminal prosecutions begun in Michigan.

Interesting Facts. The public will do well to note the fact that already fifteen of the national banks which closed their doors in recent weeks have been authorized to resume business, and on Wednesday five other closed banks made formal request for authority to open their doors.

The report of the business of the "Soo" canal for the month of July shows the following increase and decrease over the corresponding month last year: Passages, increase, 23; registered tons, decrease, 53,157; freight tons, increase, 90,973; passengers, decrease, 1,393. The freight tonnage, 1,926,210 tons, is the largest in any month of the canal's history.

Ohio Tobacco Will Cut Banking. There is at least one state in the union where will cut currency is not likely to be revived, even if a four-year Congress and President should repeal the salary tax on State bank notes.

The wire and nail mills of the Carnegie Company at Beaver Falls will start up on Monday, and the rod mill will resume operations later in the week.

The Treasury Department is taking measures to curtail the expenses of the national commission and the board of lady managers at the world's fair. It is stated that both of these bodies have been and are now in session unnecessarily, thus involving large running expenses.

The Board of Trade report of the loss of February last of the White Star steamer Naronic has just been issued. The construction and equipment of the steamer, the report says, were in every way satisfactory.

Crops in and around Epworth are looking splendidly and that portion of the crop, developing into a fine farming section. John H. McLeod has the best garden in the county—corn higher than the tops of a four-year-old apple tree.

A Marinette girl recently found a package of letters written by her father to her mother before they were married. The daughter read them to her mother pretending they were but recent and substituting her name for that of her mother and name of a young man known to both of them for that of her father.

Big Mills to Start Again. Pittsburgh, Aug. 7.—The extensive iron and steel plant of Jones & Laughlin will be put in operation on Monday, giving employment to about three thousand five hundred men. Every department will go on double turn, and the men are hopeful of steady employment.

The report that the Allegheny Bessemer steel works of Carnegie's at Duquesne would close down is denied. The demand for the product of this plant is sufficient to keep it running for some time to come.

A Few "Don'ts" For Wheelmen. Don't ride on any side of the road you happen to be on. Remember the old adage and "keep to the right as the law directs" at all times and in all places.
