Senators Call and Pasco, of Flor-ida, are said to have made posi-tive promises to that effect. So confident are the administration connect are the administration. Senators that they can get enough votes from the South to pass the bill, if they can only get it to a vote, that a proposi-tion has been made to republican tion has been made to republican Senators to try to get them to use their influence with the re-publican Senators who favor free coinage, not to vote for un-conditional repeal, but merely to agree to allow a vote to be to agree to allow a vote to be taken. It was stated to them that if they would secure that agreement the democratic Sena-tors would agree that the tariff should not be disturbed at this should not be disturbed at this session of Congress. The proposition was declined. In making that proposition the administration men showed that they realize the difficulty in getting the bill through the senate, even if they can get the promise of votes of a majority of the Senators.
