Washington, Sept. 30.—The leading democratic members who have been trying for the last forty-eight hours to arrange the terms of a compromise on the silver question, which would be acceptable, encountered a very determined obstacle to-day when they approached the republican anti-silver men who have thus far been acting with the democratic repeal forces. The republicans simply declare that there was no common ground upon which they could set with the democrats longer, if unconditional repeal was to be abandoned. When it came to negotiating terms with silver they announced their intention of flocking by themselves and moving their declared that if compromise were to come they were ready for a finish fight on that issue. This bellicose attitude of the republicans disheartened the democratic repealers and compelled the compromisers to halt temporarily, at least.

Senator Voorhes, chairman of the finance committee, and leader of the repeal forces, has been in no way connected with the compromise movement. He said to-day that he had no reason to despair of the passage of the repeal bill in its original form, and thought it quite ridiculous to conclude that in a body of eighty-five men a majority of fifty could not secure a vote upon any given proposition. He said that he felt convinced that the majority could hold out as long as the minority.

"If," said he, "we cannot pass the bill this fall, we can continue the effort during the winter, and if we do not conclude the work in the fall, winter and spring, we can, like Grant, fight it out on that line if it takes all summer. If I could force a vote I should of course do so, but there is no rule whereby I can do that. I am satisfied, however, that if we hold on with sufficient persistence we will get it in time."

Swiss Waiters Drop the Dress Coat. The dress coat of the waiter is absolutely to disappear from the leading Swiss hotels, so that it will no longer be possible to confound the waiters with the guests. At a recent meeting of the Union of Hotel Keepers the question was solemnly debated whether it was not practicable to clothe the waiters in a more rational dress than the hitherto obligatory swallowtail. The precedent for such a revolution has already been set in Germany. A few months ago the "Deutsche Gastwirths Verband" offered a prize for the best example of a convenient dress for the waiter. The design accepted was a tailless jacket (Joppe) of dark blue cloth, after the fashion of the steward's uniform on board ship. This has met with a wide approval in the profession, and it is already adopted by the waiter in many of the large hotels. The degree of attractiveness of the waiters are marked on the collar. The ober-kellner, or head waiter, wears three stars on his collar, Franz or Jean two stars and the Piccolo one star.—Bern Bund.

Income From German Railway Stations. It is the custom in Germany not to allow persons on the platforms of railroad stations save the actual travelers except on payment of a small fee, which fee in large cities constitutes quite an income. Thus during the eight months from January to August, 1891, the Friedrichstrasse station in Berlin took \$4,576 marks, the Alexander Platz station 13,779 marks, the Silesian station 10,064 marks and the Potsdam station 8,223 marks.—American Register.
