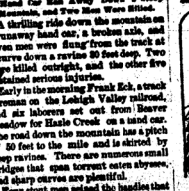

The reports this month, with rare exception, show that while wheat has made small growth, the plant, December 1, was in fairly healthy condition. The small growth is due to late sowing and dry weather. For the southern counties, the average condition is reported at 84 per cent; for the central, 80 per cent; and for the northern, 90 per cent, comparison being with vitality and growth of average years. The figures one year ago were 82, 83, and 97. The presence of insects is noted by a few correspondents, but the injury done by them, if any, is hardly perceptible. The ground has been well covered with snow since the 23d of December. The total number of bushels reported marketed in November is 1,704,331. The number of bushels reported marketed in the four months August, November is 6,358,371, which is 378,825 bushels less that reported marketed in the same month last year. Pasture this fall has not been good, particularly in the northern counties, and the condition of live stock is reported from five to seven points below a full average. Big reduction in price of smoked meats at Orr Bros. & Co.

The report of the superintendent of vessels ("Star") canal shows that the estimated value of freight which has gone through the locks at the Soo in 1895 is more than \$145,000,000, an increase over last year of \$10,000,000. The canal was open to navigation 211 days, or 14 days less than during 1892, the present season having opened May 1 and closed December 5 at 6:30 a. m., by the passage of the propeller John M. Newell. The number of vessels passing through the canal this year aggregated 12,008, sails, 674 unregistered. The cargo of which 8,373 registered, 2,555-arrived 11,796, 5,2 tons of freight, and 18,869 passengers; there were 4,111,535 one of one passenger, or about 857,000 tons less than last year. The wheat carried was 48,481,052 bushels, or nearly 2,500,000 bushels more than last year.
