BURIED GOLD AND WHISKY.

No Hurry, For the Whisky is Growing Bigger and the Gold No Worse.

Mr. W. K. Smith of this city owns a farm of some 300 acres on the west shore of Sarawak's island, on which there is said to be a treasure of \$100,000 buried and alongside of it a big trunkful of bottles of whisky. The particulars in regard to the matter were learned from Mr. Smith himself a few days ago on the steamer Kellogg.

During the past winter, Mr. Smith stated, some parties had been looking holes all over his farm in search of treasure buried there. The work had been done at night, and the neighboring farmers had seen the lanterns flitting around the place and mistaken them for signs of a mine.

The treasure, which is by some said to be buried here, was found by a stranger, who afterward had the misfortune to be hit by a bullet in the chest and the doctor undertook to drop him of heart disease in a hotel in this city. He had time to recover the gold, which is mostly in 2000 pieces. While in the hospital the doctor happened to see his patient and also the spot where the treasure was buried.

When asked why he had made no effort to recover this treasure he said, "I do not intend to take the trouble to dig for it, as I have no use for the money, and as for the whisky I will have them pick it up and send it to me."

English Horse Exports.

In spite of the imports from Poland, Finland, Holland and over America and part of horse enormously exceeds the imports in value. A three year total gives \$2,300,000 of exports as against \$280,000 of imports, and the quality and price of English horses is steadily rising. The imports do not include those from Ireland, which until recently supplied the entire Belgian army with mounts and at present largely fill the ranks of the London cavalry. They fetch on the average about £20 apiece, and as a new handsome colt £100 the liver enjoys the temporary use of a capital of £150 and the services of the driver. But from the horse's point of view this incline is hardly to be deplored.—London Spectator.

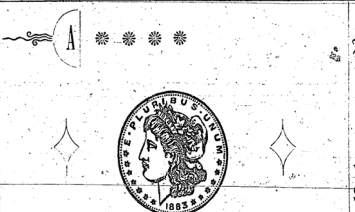
