MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE.

Seventy-eight of the marriages in every county take place between the ages of 20 and 30.

During the last 20 years in England there were 4,820 marriages and 5,987 divorces.

In almost every county the greater number of divorces is granted in the month of the year.

A Virginia wife was set free because the defendant does not come home until 10 p. m. and then keeps this plaintiff awake talking.

A Tennessee court liberated a wife because the defendant does not visit himself, thereby causing the plaintiff great mental anguish.

The Empress Theresa made an appeal against the marriage of men over 60 and women over 50, but so strenuous was the objection of widows and widowers that the law was soon repealed.

If a wife in India is abandoned by her husband, she waits eight years if he has gone on a pilgrimage, six if he went to study and three if he traveled for pleasure, and then is legally divorced and allowed to remarry at her pleasure.

Some states forbid marriage between whites and full blooded negroes or Indians. Others legalize marriage between whites and negroes. In some or two no degree is mentioned, but marriage is forbidden between a white man or woman and a "person of color" to be necessary to the law.

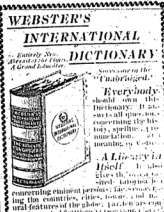
