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The South Australia Orchard Company reports that its orchards have increased from 268 to 604, and though the price of fruit is still low, for prices and a large yield are anticipated during the coming season.

The prohibitionists of Michigan county got in debt for campaign purposes, and at their county convention chairman Prof. Samuel Dickie appealed to the delegates to either pay up or repudiate, whereupon several men paid the entire amount.

Seventeen vessels of the Navy have earned premiums for speed and horsepower, in excess of the contract of guarantee aggregating \$2,241,586, and about one-half of this amount has been paid to Cramp & Sons. The Minneapolis won \$14,100 in premiums, the largest amount ever earned by any vessel.

The G. A. R. men have sent a formal protest to Mr. Cleveland the attention of the coming national encampment at Pittsburg for the unjust treatment of old soldiers have received from the Cleveland administration. Out of 150 employees dropped from the rolls of the record and pension division of the war department 71 were Union veterans. It is said that the records of some of the ex-soldiers show them to have been among the most efficient clerks in the division, while those of others were below the average in their efficiency records. Old soldiers have also been discriminated against in other departments, particularly in the agricultural department and in the various branches of the interior department, including the government printing office and the pension printing office.

This same class will improve their lands, build houses and barns and in a short time will stand side by side with the manufacturer and the merchant, in advancing the industrial progress of the locality where they reside. Expensive Warfare. The cost of firing one of Krupp's 130 to steel guns is \$550, or adding the cost of the projectile \$200, about \$750, or about \$100 per shot.
