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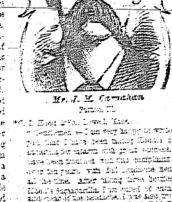

MISTAKES OF MORTON. Has He Not Recognized Organized Labor? A Few Questions Asked. The secretary of agricultural union is always a little hard to pick with him, and just before sailing for Europe two weeks ago he gave orders to have the matter fixed up "officially." Commenting on this The Evening Star, Washington, said: "It is stated at the department of agriculture that the secretary does not propose to recognize any private organization on condition in connection with the government work. He has declined to receive suggestions or in any way permit to be influenced that he has official cognizance of the existence of labor organizations. Now a great deal of difference between the secretary and the Typographical union is their own affair, but what is the official position of the government? It is really true that he has consistently abstained from shielding them upon laboring organizations in all cases? Did he not officially acknowledge the existence of the Farmers' and Husbandry when he in his notorious speech before the agricultural congress at Chicago, espousal of which was widely circulated by his own agricultural enterprises, and served at the time which had made the head of his department a member of the president's cabinet? Has he not even conducted his own official relations with the Grand Army of the Republic? When he came into the office of the department of agriculture at Washington the names of a great many veterans of the famous battle. Are you laborers worthy of their hire? Are not the union printers and the representative farmers of the American Union carrying their honest wages? Is the good of their organized labor a real injury to organized capital? And who will say why the union men who so gently met at Pittsburgh should not for their work receive the kindest consideration? Has J. M. Julius Sterling Metzer rate those three classes among the lowest and is unworthy of official notice? Are they made up of bad citizens? Do they form and support gangs and such like trusts and vote for piracy and diamond and an invasion, take? Really worthy they do not in Maine or Vermont. If they do elsewhere, we shall soon know it. All together then one may say. Keep their numbers secret, but it is safe to estimate that the secret has nearly 1,000,000 members. The roster of the Grand Army has 300,000 members in all, and has a membership of approximately 40,000, according to the latest official reports. Grover Cleveland blundered badly when he appointed to the high office of secretary of agriculture a man who has literally disappointed the farmers of our land. But then he won't last long.

What Free Wood Means Under the New Law. In anticipation of free wood, the farmer has been suffering ever since the election of 1892. He has been practically forced in all these months to take the free trade price in the market at a loss. The increased production of wood in the United States in 1892, as against the total production of that year was 364,000,000 pounds. In the past year the same amount has been decreased from 47,000,000 to 46,000,000. This is a result of the participation of the opening up of the market of one country to the unrestricted competition of the wood growers of other lands. The New York Times of Aug. 27 is entitled: "A man worth \$8,000 in the first half of the year 1894 and spent it before the year was over." He wants now to know if he shall be taxed for that in 1895. The new tariff law will produce a lucrative business for customs attorneys. At a convention in Wisconsin a few weeks ago the party managers were struggling to find a form of expression suitable for a resolution adopted at a Democratic platform.
