TAMMANY TRIUMPHANT.

Van Wyck Elected First Mayor of Greater New York.

New York State Goes Democratic. Ohio Elects a Republican Governor With the Legislature Free. Iowa Goes Republican.

New York, Nov. 2.—Tammany's victory in the first municipal election in Greater New York is a sweeping one. The only question remaining to be settled at 11 o'clock is the one of the plurality by which the entire ticket headed by Robert A. Van Wyck has carried the gigantic municipality. It can scarcely be less than 60,000 and may be larger.

The indications are the Democrats have a sure majority of the state assembly. In the greater city it is estimated from very meager returns that the Republicans will be 45 Democrats and 100 Republicans, while in the upper part of the state there are said to have been changes from 100 Democrats to 100 Republicans in the last assembly.

Des Moines, Iowa, Nov. 2.—Returns from about one-fourth of the 2,001 precincts in the state show that the Republican plurality will be about 17,000. Baltimore, Nov. 2.—The Republicans have elected their municipal ticket in Baltimore by majorities ranging from 4,000 to 6,000, but the state ticket is in doubt, and there is some reason for believing that the Democrats have carried the city and county tickets.

Boston, Mass., Nov. 2.—Corrected returns from 248 cities and towns in the state, including the complete vote of Boston, give Everett 142,026; Williams 79,127; Wolcott 164,992. The same cities also returned for Governor Everett 142,848; Williams 103,457; Wolcott 255,767.

Sioux Falls, S. D., Nov. 2.—Indications are that the Republicans have won in South Dakota. Smith (rep) is elected judge in the first district. The Republicans have elected judges in the second, fourth, fifth and sixth districts.
