When Nettie M., the beloved wife of Will H. Thomas, departed this life for the great hereafter from whence none ever return, she died as she lived. Surrounded by her nearest and dearest, those who lay at rest in this world, she quietly breathed her last.

It is inconceivable that one so rich in blessing—a devoted husband, loving parents, brothers and sister, four almost babies who need a mother's gentle guidance—should be taken in the full bloom of womanhood, and nothing but the true Christian spirit and a firm belief in the hereafter could sustain the bereaved ones in submitting so uncomplainingly to "They will be done."

The funeral services were held at the home Sunday afternoon at two o'clock. Hundreds from all classes called to pay their last respects.
