Be it further resolved that there will be no loss to growers in case of fire or total loss of crop or anything unforeseen and that no deduction be made, that the original price and contract stand. That said pass will be inspected and paid for at grower's station; that there be no roguing done unless a satisfactory per cent be paid for damage between grower and company. Farmers are hereby requested not to make any new contracts until prices are satisfactory adjusted.

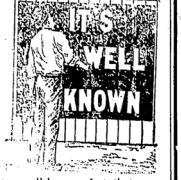

THE SALE WAS HELD

The Wisconsin Land & Lumber Co. Purchases Wm. Mueller Co. Holdings

AN AMICABLE AGREEMENT

Wm. Mueller, Jr., to Retain an Active Part in the Management.

The assets of the William Mueller Co., were sold by Circuit Court Commissioner Tracy at Menominee last Thursday and the Wisconsin Land & Lumber Co., was the purchaser. It will please the people of Schoolcraft county to know that Mr. William Mueller, Jr., so well and favorably known here, will retain an active part in the management of the property. It is thought that the mill project at Blaney will become a reality and that in the future much of the timber from the holdings of the company will be manufactured at Blaney. If this is true, it means that Blaney will become one of the prominent mill centers of the peninsula, and will ensure the perpetuity of the bustling and well built little city.

Speaking of the transaction, the Menominee Herald-Leader of Thursday evening had the following to say: Promptly at eleven o'clock this morning a little knot of men gathered at the head of the stairs in the court house entrance and listened to Court Commissioner John E. Tracy on the landing below disposed of the immense assets of the defunct Wm. Mueller Lumber Co. for \$2375,000 to the Wisconsin Land & Lumber Co. The purchasers were the only bidders. The offer was made through R. C. Flannigan. The sale, which opened at ten o'clock attracted a number of prominent men from different parts of the peninsula, and Chicago, most of them representing the creditors.

When the sale by auction of the immense holdings of the Wm. Mueller Co., which include the town of Blaney, the Blaney & Southern railroad and 30,000 acres of land, partially covered with valuable timber, the biggest deal of that kind ever concluded in the upper peninsula was put through, and the lumber firm of Wm. Mueller & Co., which has been prominently identified with the timber of the upper peninsula, became a matter of history. The firm was incorporated in 1838 in Schoolcraft county, Mich. The principal output was cedar products until 1892, when they purchased large blocks of timber land and founded the town of Blaney. In 1906 the firm turned their plant over to their creditors who have been conducting

the affairs of the company ever since. Mr. Wm. Mueller, Jr., who was present at the sale, was in consultation with his attorney before the sale. After the sale had been concluded, when asked as to the future of the company, he stated that he was unable to give out anything at present, but within a few days he would be able to do so. It was the prevailing opinion among many who were present that an amicable agreement had been reached between the purchasers, creditors and defunct corporation, and that Mr. Wm. Mueller, Jr., will retain an active part in the affairs of the company.

The Wisconsin Land & Lumber Co., with headquarters at Hermansville, who this morning took over the holdings of the Wm. Mueller Co., is the second largest company in the world devoted to the manufacture of hardwood flooring. It is capitalized for \$600,000 and has a daily output of 50,000 feet of lumber. This is the largest mill in the state. Several years ago they purchased the Simmons Lumber Co., consisting of the town of Simmons, a railroad connecting with the Soo and Ironmen's mill at Marquette. For a time the mill in that place was kept running, but owing to continual friction with the mill hands, which resulted in several strikes being honored, the place was closed down and all the lumber is now cut at the Hermansville mill. With the acquisition of this new purchase they become the largest holders of timber lands and real estate in the upper peninsula. A competent authority declared this morning that the only reason they made the purchase was to protect themselves as they are among the largest creditors.
