





From the report made to the board of public works and the city council by City Clork Christenson for the year ending April 1, 1911, we glean the following that may be of interest to the general public.

At the present time there are 318 paying customers of the water system, of which 295 are residences. The receipts for the year were 85, 1690, 18, of which amount \$1,201, 45 was received for water rent. The expenses ingreented \$5,212, 10 of which amount \$2,201, 10 was public for pumping. The extensions covered by the 1910 tax angeorated \$5,708, 50, and the new work such as new meters, catch basins, trins and support of pumps, hydraulic valve and installation of sume, amounted to \$858, 10.
