

## SOME SURPRISES

**Sheriff Howard and Prosecuting Attorney Hixson Not Candidates for Re-nomination.**

The aspirants for county office, submitted for the primaries to be held August 22d, had to file their petitions on or before four o'clock last Saturday, and when that hour was reached, it was ascertained that Sheriff Howard, who had served but one term, and Prosecuting Attorney Hixson, both failed to file their petitions, and will therefore not be candidates at the primaries.

Howard was defeated in his course probably by personal reasons. He made a popular official and would have secured a re-nomination without opposition had it been an aspirant for the office. Hixson showed that the county had given him loyal support in years past, and as there were two other candidates in the field this year, he would remain out of the race, and let Messrs. Duntun and Johnson to "scrub" it out.

The candidates that filed are as follows:

For Sheriff, Fred M. Orr.  
For Treasurer, Milton Williams and A. J. Smith.

For Prosecuting Attorney, C. W. Duntun and Geoffrey Johnson.

For County Clerk and Register of Deeds, John N. Farshaw and Dolor LaFollette.

For Coroners, W. F. Kefauver and Stan Johnson.

For surveyor, Chenord.

Every aspirant for office is well known in the county, and will have a substantial following at the primaries.

Fred M. Orr has been a resident of Manistiquette for many years, and during much of that time has been identified with the sheriff's office as deputy or under-sheriff. He is conversant with the duties of the office and will make good.

From present appearances he will have no opposition at the primaries, and will be elected in November. Fred's many friends wish him success and will loyally support his candidacy, no matter who may enter the race, either via the slip route or through regular party channels.

Milton Williams and A. J. Smith will contest for the treasurer-ship. Smith is the present treasurer, having served in that term. Previous to his election as treasurer he served as deputy sheriff for four years. It is well known throughout the county, is a good campaigner and will leave no stone unturned to secure the office for another term. Mr. Williams is also equally well known. He has resided in Inwood township for many years, his record as sheriff for four years, his record as deputy sheriff for five years, and his record as chairman of the board for several years. He is qualified to personally attend to the duties of the office, and if nominated and elected, will move to Manistiquette, and take personal charge of the office.

There is not a better citizen in the county than Williams. He is honest, sober, industrious and competent.

C. W. Duntun, who came to Manistiquette and engaged in the practice of law about the time that Fr. Marquette discovered Cleveland, is a candidate for prosecuting attorney. He has held the office before, is considered one of the best lawyers of the upper peninsula, has been making an aggressive pre-primary campaign, and is very well satisfied with the outlook. He will be opposed by Mr. Geoffrey Johnson, son of Ned Johnson, who graduated from a law school last spring, and who has decided to engage in the practice of law in his home city. Geoffrey is popular with the younger set, is genial and a good mixer, and will push an aggressive campaign during the coming month.

John N. Farshaw, who is serving his first term as county clerk and register of deeds, is a candidate for re-nomination. He has made a first class official and has given general satisfaction. He has personal charge of his office, and promises to continue to do so in case of a re-nomination. He will be opposed by Dolor LaFollette, present city treasurer.

Dolor LaFollette is also well and favorably known throughout the city and county, and it is his intention to make an aggressive campaign.

Messrs. Kefauver and Johnson are candidates for re-nomination and re-election, and are on the ballot.

The deceased was born in Tiskilwa, Ill., thirty seven years ago, and leaves a widow, and a son aged nine years, to mourn his untimely demise.

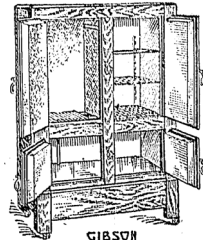
The remains were taken to Tiskilwa for burial Saturday afternoon, where the funeral services were held Sunday afternoon.

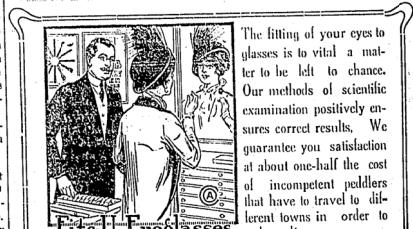

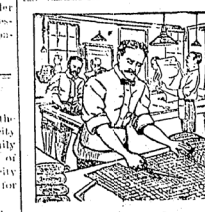

Austria-Hungary has declared war on Servia. Owing to various entangling alliances it looks as though the whole of Europe might be drawn into the fray before peace is finally declared.

The average Manistiquian is glad that the wells about the city have been retapped, for a cool, sparkling drink of water drawn from a depth of 300 or 400 feet, certainly superior in taste to the city water supply, at this season of the year.

When the little park in front of the Consolidated office is graded and sanded, a handsome soldiers' monument should be placed therein. We believe that the money needed could be raised quickly. Such a monument would not only reflect favorably upon the patriotism of the citizens of Manistique but it would also be a thing of beauty as well.

Will Manistique laboring men properly celebrate Labor day? The first Monday in September is a day that should be religiously observed by every laborer in the United States. They should parade on that day and every man that curses his daily bread by the sweat of his brow should march with his fellows. Every line of activity should be shut down for the day in question, and given an opportunity of participating. We hope that Manistique will hold a rousing celebration on the day in question.

Sheriff Howard deserves praise rather than censure for the step he took relative to the non filing of his petition for re-nomination. He did not only what every dutiful son should do. He attended political and pecuniary aspirations in order to please and properly care for his aged mother, and in so doing proves himself to be a man of every sense of the word. He was undecided in the matter up to the time limit set for the filing of petitions, and did not make a deal with another prospective candidate as some suppose he did. To his friends it has been long known that he was seriously debating the question in his own mind.

Just now Jack Greiner, or stiller editor of the Marquette Chronicle, is furnishing political prognostications for the Detroit Free Press, and if one is to judge from Greiner's past record for reliability as a guesser, little if any credence can be given to his present dope. He thinks that Crouse stands a show for securing the Republican nomination for governor. Jack can play a good game of billiards, roll a cigarette in an artistic manner, and can say "Gentlemen, what is yours," in such a seductive manner as to make a Methodist deacon forget his pledge but when it comes to prognosticating who shall or who shall not be governor, he is strictly out of his element.

Brewers of the state are getting ready to combat local option, and the scheme is this. They deduct one per cent from checks in payment of invoices materials in the interests of the "educational campaign now being carried on against nation wide prohibition." It has the handsome court house yard in the peninsula and several of the streets look as shady as park driveways. Yet while much has been accomplished in this direction, the transformation would be more quickly effected if every household would spend a little money and time in beautifying his immediate surroundings. An hour a day spent in caring for your lawn will effect a wonderful transformation, and in the period of one summer's season. When once you have made a start, you will never be content unless everything looks spick and span.

**EDITORIAL COMMENT**  
 Vote for Osborn and Bayliss at the August primaries.

Seasonable rains and warm days have forced the growth of vegetation very rapidly in this section of Cloverland, this summer.

Manistique needs a street railway line from the city to Indian Lake resorts. Such an institution would be a paying proposition during the summer season.

Not so many replicas of "September Morn" are in evidence at the dock nowadays since Chief Peterson has posted notices that everyone entering the water shall don a bathing suit. However, some are forgetting the chief's injunction and arrests may be made. A bath house should be constructed at the mouth of the river, so that persons desiring to swim could change their clothing.

Senator Scott, who is a candidate for the congressional nomination, is a humorist. ## NEEDS HOSPITAL

Manistique Should Have an Endowed Hospital Where Persons Without Means Could be Cared For.

One of the crying needs of the city is a publicly endowed hospital. It is being proven that Manistique now possesses a surgeon who is able to perform successfully all sorts of operations, and his fame is not confined to this city and county either, but he is being favorably discussed in various portions of the peninsula. He is not primarily a public benefactor, but is conducting a private hospital, and it is asking too much of him to donate his time, money and skill in performing operations upon

indigent persons. Such cases have come to his notice now and anon, where an urgent operation might save the life of the patient. He should not be compelled to do what the community at large should do. Every community has its heritage of im-pendent persons. Sickness attacks them as it does the men of an economic turn. The man that has saved his money, is in a position to care for the members of his family in case sickness invades the family circle, or when an operation is deemed imperative. The near-do-well, may in his own way, think as much for his family as does the man in more fortunate circumstances and their life to him, is just as priceless. However, a community is asking too much of its physicians and surgeons when they ask them to contribute their time, skill, and strength free of charge in order to save human life.

A hospital publicly endowed, there-fore is needed here, and that it would fill a long felt want is too evident to need enlargement upon. This community is profiting by the skill of the successful surgeon now located here. Sometimes a few hours' delay in the life of the sufferer, and quite often in the past patients have been taken to the hospital in larger cities, for an operation that had a fatal termination just because the operation had not been performed sooner. Sarcetically, Manistique has taken a long forward step within the past two years, and it should foster and encourage the surgeons now here. This can best be done with a public hospital.

## THE EXACT COST

Stumping of 50 Acres Undertaken by Stump-Puller Manufacturer.

Mr. Clarence Shepard formerly of the firm of Githman & Shepard, of Manistique whose specialty is clearing land, and who is at present the representative of the A. J. Kerstin Co. of Escanaba, manufacturers of a stump-puller and piler, is in charge of the contract of clearing fifty acres of hardwood cut-over lands located near the White Marble Lime Co.'s farm at Marblehead. The exact cost of clearing land will be determined during this test, as disinterested parties will keep tab on the labor and necessary expense. This particular tract is deemed the hardest to clear of any to be found in the upper peninsula. He uses dynamite for splitting the stumps that are too large for the machine to handle, and the cost estimate includes making the ground ready for the plow including the piling of the stumps. The government in Bulletin No. 185 states that the cost of clearing land is from \$15 to \$75 per acre. Shepard will disprove these figures without doubt. In this manner the manufacturers of actual cost of clearing land for the benefit of prospective customers, of their machines. Their machine is no longer in the experimental stage for 12,000 have been manufactured and are in use.
