

If Spellman's projections held true, a wood-fired system would save nearly \$200,000 in fuel costs in 1933 when compared to natural gas. Those savings would rise to \$475,000 y 1991. Over the 10-year period, total savings in fuel costs would be over \$3 million-enough to pay for the plant with an extra million in savings, Spellman claimed.






