Voters to decide fate of sewer bond issue

Voters in Manistique will again be asked to approve a bond issue by the city-to help pay for the city's share of an expensive sewer renovation project when they go to the polls in Tuesday's general renovation project when they go to the poils in Tuesday's general election. The bond issue would be for \$2.2 million in local funds to supplement

The bond issue would be for \$2.2 million in local funds to supplement a hoped-for grant of \$3.5 million in federal funds swarded by the state. The local bond issue would probably raise city property taxes by at least 7 mills and possibly by as much as 13 mills, depending on the interest rate on the bonds sold by the city. Voters approved the same bond request in 1979 but the city was unable to perform the work before the three-year authorization expired data time.
