



Indian Housing Thanks for telling us

Last month's news that the Sault Ste. Marie tribe of the Chippewa Indians was planning on constructing a 36-building housing development east of Manistique seemed to take the county and most everyone else by

east of Mannisque seemes to take the surprise.

That development project is well beyond the planning stage-ground-breaking is slated for Sept. 33. Why then, have local units of government been left in the dark about an extensive construction project that is certain to have some long-range effects or both Scholzfral County and Manistique Township?

Township?

County officials asked the same question and sent a list of their concerns to George Nolan, housing directs for the Sox Tribe. Nolan said that he won't be able to attend the Jul. 20 meeting of the County Boards are requested. But, he added that he will respond to the questions in writing and that he would be happy to meet with the board some other time. The board's—and our-questions seem to address two basic points: what exactly is planned for the 40-act site on the corner of the Manistipe River Road and the Factiv, Road and what will the local burden be once the moriest is finished.

It appears the local obligations to the 150-odd residents who will exentually live in the houses could be substantial.

Not only must services such as fire and police protection be provided, education for children in the housing project must lab be perpoided. When those questions are finally explained to everyone's satisfaction, we'd like another one answered: What was the point of waiting to inform the local officials of the project's existence?

Clearly, Soo Tithe officials have known what was going to happen at the site for a long time, but it wasn't until questions were brought to them that any specific information was forthorning. It may be true that the third desert have to have the ecooperation of local government to build the project, but some effort to address local concerns would go a long way towards alleviating the impression that the Indian housing is being jammed down our throats.

Many jobless workers will get increased unemployment checks

Many of Michigan's 260,000 job-less workers who are now receiving must be done whenever a tax change unemployment benefits will see a slight increase in their benefit checks beginning within the next two weeks. S. Martin Taylor, director of the Michigan Employment Security Commission (MESC), said today.

The benefit increase is a direct result of the federal income tax cut and follows, by nearly a month, a crop in benefit levels created by the recent hike in Michigan's income

Taylor explained that MESC uses workers' after-tax earnings in determining how much they will receive in unemployment benefits. Therefore, any change in federal or state income tax rates will affect after-tax earn-

The law requires that any change in federal or state income tax or social security tax rates be reflected in MESC's unemployment benefit rate tables. Consequently, the decrease in federal taxes will result in

While the federal tax cut will not increase benefits for all of Michigan's unemployment claimants, for many it could mean an increase of as much as 56.00 in weekly jobless benefits. Despite the increase, claimants weekly benefits cannot exceed the maximum of \$197.

Taylor said that the increase in obless benefits will begin to appear with checks issued during the week of July 12, covering weeks of




