SAMPSON AT SAN JUAN.

FORT MORRO OF PORTO RICO SILENCED AND IN RUINS.

Torpedo Boat Winslow Daily Damaged at Cadenas on Wednesday.

Yesterday morning the battleship Iowa of Admiral Sampson's fleet, opened the bombardment of San Juan de Porto Rico with a shot from one her ten-inch 24 inch guns. Nine more shots took part and Morro fort was quickly silenced and reduced to a pile of rubbish.

At Cadenas Wednesday afternoon, the Wilmington, Winslow and Houston attacked a small Spanish fleet and shore batteries. The Spanish concentrated their fire upon the torpedo boat, Winslow and finally succeeded in getting the range. A 4 inch shell from one of the batteries exploded directly over the Winslow killing Elisha Worth Bigley and four of the crew and wounding Lieut. J. B. Hamilton, the commander, and four men. The shell completely disabled the craft, wrecking her boilers and causing other serious damage. She was struck 18 times before the Hudson succeeded in taking her out of danger. This is the first serious result of the war.

Death of Mrs. Eli Bailey.

Emma, wife of Eli Bailey, died at her home in Lakeside Sunday morning at 2 o'clock after a lingering illness.

The last sad rites were conducted by Rev. J. M. Shank from the M. E. church, of which society Mrs. Bailey had been a member for many years. Wednesday at 10 a. m. Mrs. Gayer, T. H. Green, Chas. Chapman, R. Turpin, Frank Powell and X. H. Garner were the pall bearers and a large concourse of friends, including the W. R. C., were present at the church and followed the remains to their last resting place.

Mrs. Bailey was 60 years and one month of age, having been born in Steuben county, N. Y., April 8, 1838, her death occurring May 8, 1898. Her maiden name was Miss Emma Drake and she was married to Mr. Eli Bailey in the state of New York. Together they came to Leavenworth in this state about 1850 and finally settled at St. Louis, Grand county. They moved to this city about nine years ago.

A son, four sons and a daughter survive her, and all were present at her death except the two oldest sons, Frank E. and Abner W., who were unable to attend on account of illness. The children are: Frank E. of Idaho; Abner W. and Elsworth S. of Mackinac Island; Fred L. of this city, and Mrs. Julia Douglas of Bannock. Mrs. M. Penny is a sister of Mrs. Bailey and Mrs. Wm. Wilbur and Mrs. D. H. Cole, all of this city, sisters.

She was attended during the last part of her illness by Mrs. Douglas and Mrs. E. S. Bailey.

Mrs. Bailey had for many years been a member of the Women's Relief Corps and was the first president of the local society. She was a devout and consistent christian and was held in the highest esteem by all with whom she came in contact. She was a faithful wife, a kind loving mother and an independent neighbor and her many acts of kindness and christian charity endeared her memory to all. The family have the sincere sympathy of all in this, their hour of bereavement.

We are informed that Mr. Bailey is to eventually make his home with his daughter, Mrs. Douglas, at Bannock.

The Union Memorial Service.

The Union Memorial Service at the M. E. church Sunday evening in memory of the men who lost their lives on the Maine, passed the majority of the building the house being filled to the doors.

The program as outlined in last week's COURIER was fully carried out. Rev. J. E. Heston of the Presbyterian church delivered the Memorial address.

Mrs. E. E. Peterson chose for her vocal solo, "The Vacant Chair" and rendered it in excellent form. Rev. John M. Shank of the M. E. church spoke on "Cuba: Its Independence and Possibilities."

"War with Spain: What it means" was the subject of the address delivered by Rev. J. C. Rowsey of the First Baptist church and V. L. Hixon used his allotted 15 minutes in defining "Patriotism." The service closed with the singing of "America" by the audience. Manistique's clergy are only intensely American and their remarks, tinged with patriotic thoughts and a heartfelt love of our glorious land of liberty. That from their standpoint the present war is fully justifiable as an act of Christianity performed by a Christian nation towards suffering and down-trodden humanity was plainly evident.

The collection taken up amounted to \$24.24 and goes toward the fund being raised to erect a national monument to perpetuate the memory of the martyrs who died on the Maine.

THIRTEEN NEW STREET LIGHTS.

Manistique will then have 23 lights in the system.

At the council meeting Wednesday evening it was voted to add 13 new lights to the present system, making a total of 23. It was also decided to increase the running time one hour and in consequence the lights will now burn until 1 a. m. This will allow the men in the mills to get the benefit of the lights in going to and from their work at midnight. The work of installing the new lights will commence at once. The new lights are to be located as follows:

Corner of Main street by C. L. mill.
Corner Oak and Range streets.
Corner Michigan Avenue and Stenben street.
Corner Garden avenue and Stenben street.

WEST SIDE.
Corner Deer and Mill streets.
Corner Badger street and Houghton avenue.
East end of Range street.
Corner Water and Maple streets.
Corner Elm and CMar streets.

WEST SIDE.

Corner Deer and Mill streets.
Corner Badger street and Houghton avenue.
East end of Range street.

On the East side, the light on the corner of Pearl and Walnut streets is to be moved to the corner of Water and Pearl.

The light on the bridge is also to be moved to the head of the street in front of the laundry.
