The venerable priest, Father Chebel, died at Garden, Delta county, early Wednesday morning. He had been ill for some time and the end had been expected. Deceased was 68 years of age.

Father Chebel was born in Austria and came to America when quite young. Some time in the early fifties he came to the upper peninsula as a missionary to the Indians and for some years was stationed at the Indian mission in Chicago county. Since leaving the mission he has been stationed at many points on the peninsula and sometimes years ago had charge of the church work here. For some time past he was pastor at Garden.

Deceased was without a doubt the best known priest in the n. p. and all highly respect him.

### ON A LONG CRUISE.

The steamer Delaware, owned by Capt. W. M. Vineyard, and built by him at New London, Wis., was in port here Monday evening, leaving early in the morning for the straits. She is bound for Millford, Del., where she will be used in the general freight and passenger business on a run between that place and Philadelphia. The run is about 100 miles between the two places.
