FATHER GALLAGHER DEAD.

Had Ministered to the Spiritual Wants of Beaver Islanders for Over Thirty Years.

The following relative to the death of the venerable priest, sent out from Cross Village, appeared in the Detroit Journal of Saturday last:

The death of Fr. Gallagher, the gentlemanly and devoted minister of the Roman Catholic mission at Beaver Island, which occurred last Sunday, has bowed with grief the people whom he has led for so many years.

Big Beaver, with its lake tidflows and village of St. James, was the scene of King Solomon's brief reign over the "Morians" a half century ago. Five months in the year the island is cut off from communication with the outside world by 20 miles of stormy water and shifting ice, which separates it from the mainland. The island's population of about seven and a half score of fishermen are farmers, and most of them are Irish. Fr. Gallagher was Irish and had a rich rare brogue, and with his priestly functions was combined a gentle and warm sympathetic, and he became so much the soul of his people that he was called the "Father of the Island."

And his authority was never questioned. Instead of litigating in the courts, the islanders hid their personal and property disputes before Father Gallagher, and if ever an appeal was taken from his judgment, the instance has been forgotten. He even exercised jurisdiction over offenses against the law, and the penalties he observed were carried out, and in matters of love and family, he was looked to as the universal arbitrator.

Father Gallagher went to the Beavers as a young man 22 years ago. He did not intend to remain, but the weeks lengthened into months and the months into years and he became a fixture.

For a generation he has baptized all the children born on the island and has buried all the dead and officiated at all the weddings. His duties have taken him to all parts of the island and the neighboring islands, where his parishioners lived, and he faced the dangers of storm and inland and the place he held in the hearts of the islanders will never be filled.

Many stories are told of Father Gallagher's methods of ruling his people and one of these stories, which he delighted to tell himself, illustrates his management and in a manner explained how he maintained his hold upon his parishioners. One of his parish, a man, who will be called Dennis, was an inveterate loafer, and Father Gallagher determined to break him of the habit. Dennis called at the priest's morning and seeing Fr. Gallagher, began lamenting of his inability as a marksman.

Fr. Gallagher encouraged him in this and at the same time intimated that he could show a little himself. Dennis eagerly volunteered, and the two were eager for a trial of skill, and finally squared their horses against Fr. Gallagher's horse that he was the best shot. Fr. Gallagher warned Dennis against the evils of betting, and at the same time engaged him on and finally a shingle was set up on the fence and the shingle ranged party. Fr. Gallagher fired first. The shingle was literally peppered with shot, and when the holes were marked, it was Dennis turn to shoot. Dennis fired and not a new shot was placed on the shingle. He fired again and again with similar results and Fr. Gallagher expressed sorrow and surprise and encouraged Dennis, now thoroughly demoralized, to keep on trying and recommended him of the horse that was wounded on the result.

The dinner bell sounded and Fr. Gallagher left Dennis still shooting, with the promise that if he placed a single shot on the shingle the wager of the horse would be declared off. An hour later Fr. Gallagher came out and Dennis was still shooting and not a shot had been landed. Dennis acknowledged that he had been fairly beaten; that the horse was honestly lost, and was told to drive the horse to the barn. When he had done this and was about to start for home, Fr. Gallagher called him in, but turned him roundly upon the evils of betting and ended the lecture by restoring the horse. Dennis never boasted of the victory, and if anyone ever said an unkind word against Fr. Gallagher he would have to settle with Dennis.

The remains of the dead priest were taken to Philadelphia for interment.

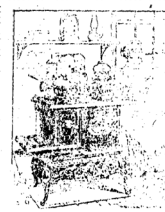

CAREFUL GREEK PARENTS. Boys Were Discouraged to School Just as Girls Are Now. The extraordinary man that the Greek boy received in his formative years made his moral training more effective than that inculcated by the most careful of modern parents. His general education, coupled with skillful and continuous physical instruction, produced a moral cultivation very similar and fully as strict as that the Christian father deems necessary for his son's education. A pugnacious, generally an old and trusted slave, led the boys to school and called for them after it closed, carried the books, looked out for the little fellows, kept the older ones from fighting and falling into bad company and had a general oversight of their conduct and street form. He was by no means a schoolmaster or even a private tutor, even being allowed to enter the schoolroom. Oftentimes ignorant in his external, he was classically learned in his loyalty to the family and its customs. My fear, however, was that for any other occupation. Though the aid of the boys' studies he was not that of the comic poet and low wit of the day he did an invaluable service in preventing vicious companionships and keeping the minds of those intrusted to his charge.
