MID-WINTER BUSTLE.

It is now in full blast at Manistique bright future prospects.

The following from the pen of Hon. Chase S. Osborn, who visited this city last week, we clip from the Soo News and republish to let our people know what others think of our city and people.

A representative of The News visited Manistique this week and found that promising and interesting little city dressed in a new suit of mid-winter bustle. Manistique has always had a reputation for stability, but it has recently taken on newer vitality and brighter prospects. There are many reasons for this. First, there isn't a better managed or regulated town in Michigan, nor one of its size better educated and schooled, nor one where a higher moral tone prevails or where the citizenship is more loyal to locality and enterprising. They work together in harmony and for a common purpose. All of these things conspire with Manistique's location for good and so the perpetuity of the place is insured. Primarily, Manistique is and has been a lumber town, situated as it is at the mouth of a stream that sends its threadlike arms about

group after group of the best pine left in the Upper Peninsula. These forests are also reached by a new railway, which is heading for Negaunee and is fast growing out of the swaddling clothes of a mere logging road. There are now down more than 40 miles of track, passing through native forest wealth of all kinds, much of which grows on a soil that will in time be subdued and will be kind to the husbandman. Infant Schoolcraft county, of which Manistique is the promising capital, is fast taking rank as a farming region and it is destined to grow rapidly. In the development of its agricultural resources it possesses a purpose in common with Chippewa county. More attention is paid in this direction all of the time, so that by the time the forest reserves are near exhausted, farming will undoubtedly have assumed the proportions of a worthy successor. It is estimated that it will take more than 20 years yet to manufacture the pine tributary to Manistique.

Not content with the sawmills alone the people have reached out and gotten a fire big iron furnace plant, which will soon be in full blast again. The Newberry ethanol plant has recently located at Manistique and will prove a valuable addition. Then great quantities of lime are made there and so on the industries are numerous and successful.

But Manistique takes unto herself more than usual pride very recently on account of being selected as the winter port of the Soo Line. Already are heard the resounding beat whistles daily, a spur track to the docks has been put in, new warehouses built and a great deal of package freight is being handled with much success and a great satisfaction to those who are promoting the idea of making a winter port of Manistique. Already 60 men are given employment in this work with prospective employment for many more. It is said that there is not an idle man in Manistique who is willing to work. In fact the volume of business at this time is very much greater than it was at the same time last winter and the prospects for the place were never brighter, all of which is pleasant to know. Manistique is all right.

A grand and successful revival has been in progress for some time under the auspices of the energetic workers of the Baptist church.

Present count concluded this week and Judge Storey and Menominee Press who are very popular in Manistique held for home on Friday and Tuesday respectively.

That restless newspaper worker, Ed Jones, of St. Ignace, has launched democratic weekly, called the Democrat, that starts out with a bright face and looking well. The fact remains that Manistique is ever newspapered, but The News doesn't want to see any of them die, any more than "the last baby."

He has settled down to permanent stability and will swear by Manistique forever. His future there is assured.

Gov. Pogue and His Associates Have a Conference Behind the Question of Calling an Extra Session of Legislature
—Pogue Insisted by U.S. Editor

Will There be a Special Session?

A lengthy conference of the Pogue administration officials from all parts of the state was held at the governor's home at Detroit to discuss a number of matters of importance to the conference and the state's general. The matter of greatest moment, however, was the question of the advisability of calling an extra session of the state legislature to consider railroad taxation and other subjects.

It was question in the public mind whether or not it was decided to call a special session. Before the close of the conference it was agreed that whatever information there was to be furnished as to the result of the deliberations should be given out by the Pogue himself. Thereupon the governor informed the reporters that the matter will continue until such time as he can safely and it is said that some of the conferees stated positively that a special session would be called about Feb. 15, although a number of those present very strenuously opposed it. Their argument was that nothing would be accomplished toward relieving railroad rates, and that the governor's administration would not be blamed all over the state for adding upon the community the expense of a session without bringing about any reforms.

The governor, however, had prepared statistics to show that the special session would not cost more than \$100,000 and that it might be the means of adding at least \$100,000 to the state's annual revenue. The Pogue administration has no intention of returning for the investment. It is the governor's idea to devote the session to not more than two measures: to extend the term of the legislature and to amend the term of franchise for all quasi-public corporations, and for all property if possible, and the other to enact a law establishing a strict limit on the amount of stock to be held by any individual on the railroads of the state. The bills have already been outlined, nothing remaining to do but to hammer them into shape.

The extra session advocates used to good advantage the argument that there being no real legislation to be passed at this time, the session should be called to deal with the real issues of the day. 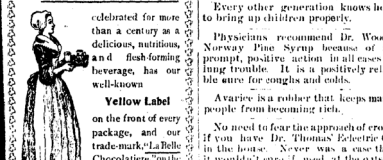
