## THE VICE-PRESIDENT DEAD.

GARRET A. HOBART SUCCESSORS TO THE BUSINESS INTERESTS OF WILLIAM A. HOBART.

Successful and Busy Life ended office of Vice President to be left vacant.

Vice President Hobart died at 3 o'clock Tuesday morning at his home at Paterson, N. J. Mr. Hobart had been ill for several weeks and began failing rapidly during the afternoon previous to his death.

Deceased was born at Long Branch, N. J., 26 years ago. He was graduated from Rutgers college in 1896, and about three months later entered upon the study of law in the city of Paterson.

Young Hobart is said to have arrived at Paterson with but \$10 in his pocket, and from this small beginning he made his way through a wealth and prominence.

In 1892 he was admitted to the bar and the same year he married the daughter of Mr. Tuttle. Mr. Hobart made his way rapidly at the bar of his native town and his bent led him early into politics.

In 1911 he was made deputy counsel of Paterson and in '12 was elected to the state assembly, of which body he was chosen speaker in the following year. For during these early years displayed that a complete knowledge of men and politics that wonderful capacity which were the key of his later success.

Both in business and politics. At the end of the second year of his activity he returned to Paterson, he managed to get and to the numerous business interests with which he had become identified. But the demands of his party would not admit of his remaining long in private life, and in 1875 he was elected to the state senate, of which body he was a chosen president in 1881. From 1881 until 1898 he was a member of the national republican executive committee and had much to do with the management of the national campaigns during those years.

Mr. Hobart was nominated and elected to the vice-presidency in 1896. He was a pleasing, smiling, genial and a good public speaker, and one of the best of our men who ever filled the high office which his death leaves vacant.

Mr. Hobart left but one child, Garret A. Hobart, Jr., a boy of 16. Family a devotee of art, died in 1898 in Italy, while there with her parents.

By the death of Mr. Hobart, the office of the vice-president of the United States becomes vacant for the rest of President McKinley's term, as the law provides no succession. A president pro tempore of the senate will be elected that body when congress assembles, who will hold the office until March, 1901. By law the accession to the presidency of the United States in the event of the president's death, devolves upon the secretary of state, the next in line being the secretary of the treasury, the secretary of war, then down through the list of cabinet officers, in order of precedence fixed by act of congress, when the death of Vice President Hobart, devolves the necessity of such provision.

Senator William F. Fry, of Maine, names as absent pro tempore of the office. He will not take the office until he is called upon by the president and a successor is chosen. That he will succeed however is generally considered.

Regarding Mr. Hobart's wealth it is stated that shortly after the election of 1896, in reply to questions by friends, he said that he could not give a guess, but that he was worth a great deal more than a dozen million dollars with a note in the bank. It would not amiss to add that the vice-president's peaceful son, Vice President Hobart Jr., occupies about \$250,000 (the company alone had \$100,000) in a policy on his life for \$100,000.

A Bed That Really Pains - Pteron-Hanging Device - Nerve of Animals Used to Restore Man's - An Animal Track Test.

Nerve of Animals Used to Restore Man's - A certain proportion of injuries to nerves the ends cannot be brought together, and this fact in the older days of surgery conditionally perplexed surgeons, even those who had earned celebrity. 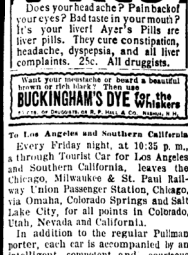
