

This serum was drewn from the blood bank, and further exhausted the supply. It is now vital that this supply be replenished. Blood plas-ma cannot be manufactured. It is only from the veins of healthy peo-ple that these serums can be made available.







OUT OF THIS WORLD—The daborately wired instrument is the radar antenna above the deck of the USS Norton Sound, and shooting skyward, lexting a triall of white vapor, is the Navy's acrobes sounding rocket used in the study of cosmic ray intensity. The rockets, fired at a joint approximately 1900 miles off the west coast of South Amorica, attained an altitude of more than .65 miles above the occ Cosmic ray data is obtained from instruments in the nose of

rockets.

By observing the powerful cosmic ray particles and studying the shances they undergo in passing through the atmosphere, scientists hope to oldain a new and cleaver understanding of nuclear forces. The energy of cosmic ray particles is millions of times greater than that which can be produced by nuclear fission.
