Every county will be entitled to one delegate for each 2000 of the total vote cast for Governor at the State Election (November, 1894) and one additional delegate for every fraction amounting to 500, but each organized county will be entitled to at least two delegates.

Under the resolution of 1858, no delegate will be entitled to sit in the convention who did not reside in the county in progress of convention.

A delegate convention of the republican party will be held at the court house in Manistique, on Thursday, Feb. 7th, at 2 o'clock p. m. for the purpose of electing three delegates to attend the republican state convention which meets at Detroit, Feb. 21, 1895, to nominate a candidate for Justice of the Supreme Court and two Regents of the State University.
