A winding staircase will lead up to the kitchen, taking the place of the cork, where there will be room for 35 persons at a time to sit and look over the exhibition grounds and the city.

Atty for Soldering Glass. An alloy formed of ninety-five parts of tin and five of copper will, it is asserted, adhere to glass with such tenacity that it may be employed as a solder for connecting tubes and to end. It is obtained by first melting the tin and then adding the copper, the mixture being stirred all the while with a wooden rod. This mixture is run into a mold and will set when needed for use. It is rendered more or less hard by the addition of one-half to one per cent. of zinc or lead.
