Mch. Law in 1908.

Last Sunday morning a mob composed of over 200 drunken men undertook to break in the entrance to the jail at Tiffin, Ohio, and take them from a number of the local jail. There had been made for hours previous and the sheriff had telegraphed Gov. McKinley for an order to place Co. E. of the state troops in the guard and local constabulary. On they pressed with a demon yell. A signal of policemen which had been shown from the steps was whisked to one side. Officer Keller, who made a brave and fever resistance, was struck on the head with a stone and kicked brutally. He was carried home unconscious.

The mob went direct to the side entrance and commenced the onslaught on the door with stones. Michael Schindler, a powerful temperance orator of the city, was one of the drunken agitators. The door was broken to splinters in a short time and when the entrance was gained there was a wild rush and the hallway was filled with excited men. Sheriff Vanost and three men stood in the opposite end. He appeared to them in a brave and strongly several times, asking them for food's sake to disperse. It did not go, for the men only grew fiercer. The entrance to the corridor is first protected by a line of shot-men. The lock was broken off with a few blows and then there entered the heavy grating.

Then it was that the guards, who were at that portion, began to fire. They shot over the rioters' heads. The men scowled at every person inside, and to kill every person they began to fire. The guards said nothing and fired by them until the attacking party had first through the grating fire. Henry Mutschler, the first man killed, was the one who carried the rope. He was the first to be killed. Then Christ Metz received a bullet through his heart. This sort of work and the determination of the guards saved the would-be liberators and they left the jail, cursing and wailing like the Vio-linists, a young Italian laborer, with the intention of getting dynamite to blow up the building, but he never put in an appearance after work.

Where the Blame Belongs.

Just at the present time the blame entire papers of this state are making great ado about the state tax claim that the present administration has been very extravagant. Any person who knows anything about public affairs is well aware that the state tax is always higher in those years in which the legislature meets. The tax of 1891 covered no expense of meeting of the legislature while that of 1893 covers it all.

Jan. 1, 1891, the state was out of debt. The appropriations made for all purposes for the years 1892-93 were \$2,162,292.10. No new state institutions were built during that period. At the close of that period, Jan. 1, 1891, there was a \$200,000 surplus in the treasury, making the total expenditures of that period \$2,362,292.10.

When the Winans' administration came in in 1891, there was \$200,000 in the treasury, and the state that year received \$129,000 refused from the United States. The tax levy was \$2,362,292.22; and at the close of that administration there was a deficit of \$229,000, making a total of \$3,591,292.22 expended in two years. The legislature in 1893 appropriated \$3,020,351.58, and out of that sum established two state institutions—\$75,000 for the upper peninsula, and \$245,000 for the feeble-minded institute at Lapar.

The Southland & Lumber Co. has just closed a contract with the Mining Co. for 25 acres of land at Manistiquette, and for the erection and partial operation on this ground, within one year, of three large mills, which will employ at least 100 men each.

The world's record for railroad speed was broken last week by a special train on the Lake Shore & Michigan Southern railroad which ran from Chicago to Buffalo, a distance of 210 miles in 481 minutes 7 seconds, an average speed of 63.60 miles an hour including stops.

Alex. McLeod, while hunting about one mile and a half from Taylor's camp, was killed by the accidental discharge of his rifle on Thursday morning. A coroner notified the boys at the camp, and the unfortunate man was conveyed as rapidly as possible to that point. He died about an hour after reaching camp. The remains were brought to town on the railroad and interred in the cemetery here—General Maris Herald.

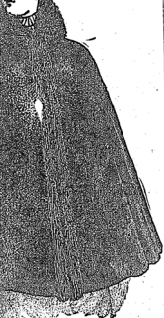
