Gen's New Watches.

A Prosperous Report.
A circular has been issued by Richard & Brownell, of the San Democra, which shows, in condensed form, the statistics prepared by the "Soo River Marine Association" for that year, concerning the business done by the Soo canal during the past ten years. A striking feature of the report is the immense increase in the value of freight passing through the locks during the period named. In 1881 the total value was \$28,962,912.93, while for the season just closed it amounts to \$102,214,948. This represents 4,000,000 tons less, and freight, and 2,013,375 tons went bound freight at an average value \$11.31 per ton. This is an excellent showing, and the beauty of it is the business will still continue to increase.
