

NEW LIQUOR RULING

NEW LIQUOR RULING

One important change recently made by the state liquor control commission is the provision requiring that all purchasers of any alcoholic liquor be at least 21 years of age. The provisions of the ruling must be prominently displayed on signs in all establishments where alcoholic drinks are sold. Previous to inauguration of the new regulation, persons who had attained the age of 18 years could legally purchase beer. The new ruling, which is now in full effect, eliminates this part of the 1933 law, and the proprietors of drinking establishments are responsible for its enforcement.

The liquor control commission has indicated that its policy hereafter will be positive and definite about enforcement of the new regulation. It is up to the licensees to definitely ascertain the age of customers, if there is any doubt, before making a beer or liquor sale. If the licensee is unable to ascertain the eastomer's age, and if there is any doubt, he should refuse to make the sale. This may lose line a small amount of business but it may prevent him from losing his license.


