

While everybody blames everybody else for the increasing prices of foods, the Detroit Times sees the real cause of the high prices in the mounting taxes.

High prices have been blamed on the scarcity of foods due to the drought, but the real villain, according to the Times, is the mounting tax burden. The latest increase in the tax on the family pay envelope was as far as it used to be. She blames the grocer and butcher, and they in turn blame the packer. To carry it further the packer blames the farmer and the farmer says it's the result of the drought.

We are frustrated, not so much by the high cost of living as the high cost of government. The high cost of government is being brought to the working man's table. For people realize the number of taxes taken at a point of need before it reaches the table.

If the butcher, the packer and the farmer take too much profit, there should be a curb on such profit taking, but by the same token, there should definitely be a curb on government spenders who take exorbitant taxes on everything we eat and wear and use.

The rich can afford to pay high taxes and get good need. It is the poor who are hurt most. And the high spender of taxes must generally suffer for the harm he does to the poor.

And according to Roger Babson, eminent economist, the mounting tax costs are eating straight to a program of luxury-resistance. In a recent dispatch from New York Mr. Babson says:

"Laxer is not the most powerful group in the United States. There are about 14 million laborers in this country, while there are 15 million consumers. This year we have seen less than a million workers take home by their own efforts. Think what would happen if 15 million consumers should go on strike. Already there are signs of luxury-resistance in the country. Resistance to the rising cost of living becomes more evident as each day passes."

Paying out that since 1933 living costs have increased 19 per cent with housing leading the parade with 37 per cent and food rising closely with 29 per cent. Mr. Babson declares that the cost of maintenance already has been added in rents. Last spring at the height of the CIO marches, many cities in Ohio and Michigan went on a strike, clear-cut strike.

Another paragraph from his news release follows: "Most of the people here had a good mark-up on their goods, but now they really go through the roof. Their rice is approximately 76 per cent. Pork chops at 44 cents a pound—up 50 per cent—and sirloin steak at 120 cents a pound—up 70 per cent—in the class of raw delicacies. Not families can afford to buy them, while many who can afford by refuse to do so because the price is out of line with other foods. Flit of sole, lamb chops and roast chicken are getting the call over pot roasts and steamed ham."

The growing consumer-resentment also is making itself felt in the clothing field, and lesser effects noted in other commodity fields. "We hear a lot about paying more money in the worker's pay envelope," Mr. Babson continues. "What I want to see is the pay envelope putting more goods in the workers' market basket. Apparently, higher wages mean improvement to the great many people if the cost of living does not increase. A 70 per cent hike wiped out if living costs increase 60 to 75 per cent."

WAGE SCALE IS SET UP BY CITY COUNCIL

Common Labor To Be Paid Minimum Of 48 An Hour—Cents Per Hour

Plans And Specifications For Bidders Approved At Meeting On Tuesday

Minimum wages to be paid common labor on Manistique's PWA project were set at 48 1/2 cents per hour by the city council at an adjourned session Tuesday night. The council also had all classifications of labor employed on the project were included in the plans and specifications for bidders approved Tuesday night. Before voting on the entire document, the council set the minimum wage rates, a vote being required to establish the controversial rate for common labor.

Councilmen Harry Abramson and Frank Lahms favored a minimum wage for common labor of 50 cents an hour. Other members of the council have voted 48 1/2 cents per hour. A motion by Abramson, supported by Dahms, to fix the rate at 50 cents was lost. A subsequent motion by Prince, seconded by Schuman, was carried, three to two to fix the rate at 48 1/2 cents.

After the wage schedules had been adopted the council voted on the entire document containing the plans and specifications. The motion carried, four to one, with Abramson casting the lone dissenting vote.

At the meeting Monday night the council had authorized P. H. Beauvais, city manager, and L. B. Chittenden, city clerk, to take the plans and specifications to the Detroit PWA office. This will eliminate any delay in obtaining final approval and also give the city clerk an opportunity to study bookkeeping methods used in connection with such projects.

Amount To Be Spent On City's Tax Rolls More Than Half Total Levy

A total of \$125,167.13 will be spread upon the township and city tax rolls during the next fiscal year, according to the levy prepared during the annual meeting of the board of supervisors here Monday and Tuesday.

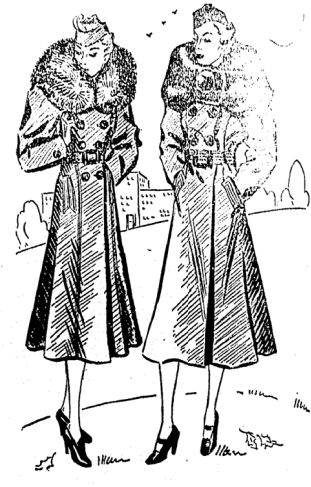

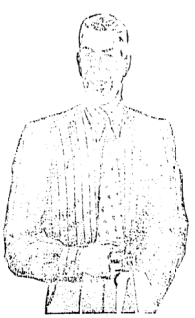
