They awakened, not long after midnight, to find a man stumbling about their room, occasionally lighting a match to guide his unsteady steps. Mr. Simcox retained both his presence of mind and his courage and demanded to know what the intruder wanted, whereupon the latter retreated.

Yielding to his wife's entreaties Mr. Simcox did not follow up the man, but after he and his wife had hastily dressed they made their exit through a window and Mr. Simcox got a police officer. They found the man snoozing on the sofa. He was taken to jail, but Mr. Simcox did not care to prosecute and the matter was settled, the man paying \$75 to cover the damage he had done to the floor and elsewhere in the house. The man gave the name of John Koski and he is said to live at the furnace location.

Death Under Wheels.

In attempting to alight from the east bound North County main train at the Pioneer avenue crossing last Monday morning, John O'Neil, 150 Springfield, rolled under the wheels and had one leg nearly severed and the other injured, besides sustaining internal injuries. The man was found soon after-ward by Allen McDonnell, who chanced to pass the crossing. The young man was well known here. Of late he had been employed as a stevedore on a steam shovel.
