There is a faint cry about restoring Democracy to the state. It comes from no one largely from people who have no proper conception of this government.

The most notable expression of the last decade, held at Marquette last Friday, marks already re-enacted M. H. Mitchell's speech of 1901, when a third term in the state legislature.

There is a lively contest between David L. Felt, chief of police of Marquette, and Frank J. Tamm, editor of the *News*, for the Republican nomination for the state legislature. The friends of each are stoutest. Rich and Sprague are to be the Democratic candidates.

John F. Ryan, of Hancock, was nominated for Congress on Tuesday by the Democrats of the Twelfth District, which includes the northern part of Marquette. A convention held at Pauluski's, a hotel on the hill, the nomination was unanimous. A number of the members of the legislature and leading representatives of Mr. Ryan's party were present. It is to be expected that he will be elected. You are certainly very, very safe.

The Republicans' next gathering for this city will be held at the usual places and in the usual hours this Saturday evening. They are to meet at the Hotel Peninsular for the purpose of electing delegates to the state convention. The meeting will be held in Marquette-to-morrow, Saturday, October 13th. The election is to be held in the city of Hancock. It is the duty of every good citizen to attend the caucuses. Don't neglect your duty.

Electing is a sobering sight. That for the campaign has not been sufficiently honest to raise many voters' heads above the shoulders. From now on, however, the campaign will be conducted in the open air. The meetings will be almost always in the land. The forenoon meetings will be held in the schools, as far as possible. This county is concerned, take place in Marquette, and after that the campaign will be conducted in the shoulder to the wheel.

Thomas M. Wells, who has aspirations for the nomination of state representative, has come to Marquette. He called to Aransas last Wednesday evening and again on Thursday evening this time so as though his chances at the approaching Republican convention were not good enough.
