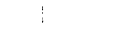

Common Council.

The regular monthly meeting of the Common Council of the City of Negaunee, was held in the City Hall building evening, February 3rd, 1914. Meeting called to order by Mayor Hagan.

Present:—Ald. Nelson, Frowse, Collins, Hagan, Wasmuth, Driscoll, Mitchell, Irenbach and Williams.

Ald. A. Driscoll.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion approved.

The petition of Mrs. Catherine Trorer asking to be exempt from the payment of taxes on account of being a widow and being exempt to pass year, was on motion of Ald. Wasmuth supported by Ald. Hagan, referred to Finance & Taxation Committee.

The petition of Mrs. Annamie asking to be exempt from the payment of water rates on account of being a widow, was on motion of Ald. Driscoll supported by Ald. Frowse, referred to Finance & Taxation Committee.

The petition of Mrs. Emma asking to be exempt from the payment of taxes on Lot 15, Block 8, Jackson Iron Co's Addition, on account of being a widow, was on motion of Ald. Irenbach supported by Ald. Wasmuth, referred to Finance & Taxation Committee.

The petition of Mrs. Sarah asking to be exempt from the payment of water rates on account of being a widow, was on motion of Ald. Irenbach supported by Ald. Wasmuth, referred to Finance & Taxation Committee.

The petition of Mrs. Catherine Kelly, widow, asking to be exempt from the payment of water rates, was on motion of Ald. Mitchell, supported by Ald. Frowse, granted.

The petition of Mrs. A. Peteraki, widow, asking to have taxes remitted, was on motion of Ald. Driscoll, supported by Ald. Mitchell, referred to Finance and Taxation Committee.

The petition of Mrs. Sarah, widow, asking to be exempt from payment of taxes was on motion of Ald. Driscoll, supported by Ald. Wasmuth, referred to Finance and Taxation Committee.

Nick Martell appeared before the Council complaining that his personal tax was too high, whereas on motion, same was referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

Finance and Taxation Committee, to whom was referred the petition of James A. McClain and James Jewell, who asking for refund of taxes, recommended that an order be drawn for \$11.00 in favor of Mr. McClain and one for \$6.00 in favor of Mr. Jewell. Committee also reported that it has investigated the petition of W. Murphy in regard to taxes and has not noted anything wrong. Report was adopted.

On motion of Ald. Mitchell, supported by Ald. Thomas, the City Attorney was instructed to obtain from the State Tax Commission all laws relative to extending.

Committee on water works recommended that city enter into contract with H. E. Woodington for the purchase of 200 meters, to be purchased as needed, on motion of Ald. Mitchell, supported by Ald. Collins, the resolution was adopted and Mayor was instructed to sign contract.

A complaint made against Foreman Edward was on motion of Ald. Driscoll, supported by Ald. Hagan, was referred to Police Committee and Chief of Police for investigation.

1 Case of scarlet fever occurred in January, 1 case of diphtheria reported on the last day of January; 2 cases of typhoid fever occurred in January.

The condition of Tool Lake remains good. No increase in the amount of phosphoric has been needed. No taste has been noticed in the water.

Pneumonia is on the decrease. About enough is not quite so common.

Dr. J. L. Nelson, Health Officer, reports that Ald. Nelson should make a monthly report, so that citizens would know what the true status regarding the Mayor stated that he would take up the matter with the insurance and arrange to have regular reports made.
