M. O. COSTLY AT WHITEHALL. The municipal light and water plant at Whitehall is in a large proposition and the taxpayers are paying the price as usual, and probably without realizing it as in the cases of most municipal plants it is hard to get an accurate accounting of expenses. For the year ended March 1, 1911, the plants showed a deficit of \$1,117.79, though it was credited with \$3,195 for village water and light. The deficit for the fiscal year ended March 1st is \$1,957, and it is safe to say that no interest, taxes or depreciation has been charged against it. The deficit is really greater than the mere figures of the plant's operation show. The village is still being charged \$145 per acre for 37 acres largely without incandescence clusters have supplanted all the arcs. As new incandescence clusters are charged at only \$10 per pair, the 31 clusters which superseded the arcs light are certainly charged at a pretty high rate. Whitehall taxpayers would be money ahead if the lighting plant were "junked" and the village purchased its light.—Chicago Tribune.

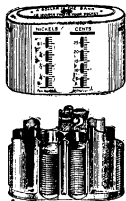
