## FEATURE NOT ON THE BILL

Incidents of Ouling of Boy Club of St. John's Church —

It was then ascertained that the accident to the first truck was more serious than had been apprehended, the loss of another truck was secured and with George Roberts as driver it set out on a return trip to camp. Meanwhile the three youthful quarantines had been having a trying experience. When midnight came and no truck had arrived they secured the better portions of camp equipment and with the lighter and more valuable luggage moved back into the Johnson camp, about midnight, a couple of lampjacks who had lost their way tried to force their way into the camp, which they supposed was unoccupied, but a couple of shots which the boys aimed skidway frightened the intruders away. It was nearly 2 a. m. when Roberts reached the scene with the second truck, loading was quickly accomplished and the boys reached their homes in time for breakfast.

## Food Prices

People have at least one thing to be thankful for in this season of the highest prices ever known, and that is that money is not scarce. Today when all the necessities of life are from one-half to four times as high as any time in our history and the dollar is more money in circulation, it may seem as though we were getting more for our labor. If this was so, iron, steel, and coal would be more plentiful, the prices of everything that would be sold on here.

But this is not so. We hope that it will soon be over this. It is true that a man gets two dollars a day now when he only got one dollar a year before the war. But as the season takes a little more than two dollars out to buy what was worth a dollar here. So we are in reality not so well off as we were before money became plentiful and price high.

A farmer is getting \$2.30 for his wheat now instead of \$1.00, and if fertilizer and farm labor add up that have been so doubled in cost, he isn't nearly so well off as he could get a dollar a bushel for his wheat and bird bands could be had for \$1.50 a day and "keep."

It is true that we have more money here before the war, but it is also true that prices are so much higher in proportion it becomes necessary for us to stretch every penny that we use, and we will find that even in great difficulty we are actually bordering on poverty.

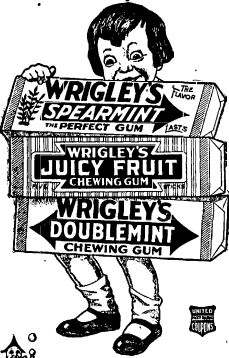

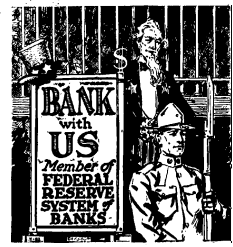
